

Music in Hospitals

Creating joy through live music

Music in Hospitals (MiH) is a charity whose mission is to improve the quality of life for adults and children with all kinds of illness and disability through the joy and therapeutic benefits of professionally performed live music in hospitals, hospices, day care centers, special schools, nursing and residential homes.

Their concerts are given by small groups of professional musicians who tailor repertoire to suit the individual needs of the audience. Programmes range from classical to jazz, folk, pop, show and old time; often a number of these styles can be included within one concert. In addition to their high standard of musicianship, the musicians possess exceptional communication skills, which enable them to involve audiences beyond a musical level and "bring the person out of the patient."

Music in Hospitals concert lasts just over an hour, but their musicians provide more than just live music. They will arrive in good time for their performance, allowing time to meet their audience, and will stay to chat afterwards. They often find that the musicians take on the role of friend and listener as they chat to patients about the kind of day they have had or the memories the music has sparked. This is particularly welcomed by patients who have little contact with relatives or friends.

The process of determining where new housing should go is not entirely straightforward. At a high level, the National Planning Policy Framework has set the principles in favour of more housing and the Wiltshire Core Strategy has laid down policies and minimum numbers for the county. In some cases, the Core Strategy specifies where new housing should go but in non-strategic locations like this Division, the picture needs colouring by other means.

The first driver for new developments can be developers themselves. Some of you will know that one developer proposed a very unwelcome housing estate outside Great Cheverell. Fortunately, they were seen off at appeal last year after much helpful input from the community. At a smaller scale, the Eastern Area Planning Committee has recently rejected a proposal in Market Lavington on the grounds that entry and exit to the site would be very dangerous, but this may yet face challenge at appeal.

A different problem has been encountered in Victoria Park where many residents would welcome some housing development if it would facilitate repair of the crumbling roads and footpaths and allow their adoption by Wiltshire Council. However, despite already having 50 houses, Victoria Park is designated in planning terms as "open countryside", which would normally prevent new development. I am trying to find a way around that problem.

More positively, Neighbourhood Planning teams in West Lavington, Market Lavington and Worton, are working to identify possible development sites and to assess community opinion about them. The required procedures are challenging to say the least, particularly for a small community reliant on volunteers with little or no professional experience. I commend their hard work (and some of you may know I should probably declare an interest here).

In all of these considerations, one common theme is the problem of highways and traffic. Our local road network is among the worst in the county. Let me know if you have a spare £15,000,000 or so, which could fulfil my ambition for a relief road on the Plain.



Alleluia! Christ is Risen! That was our cry as we celebrated Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday. It is the cry every Christian makes as part of their ongoing faith in the days and weeks that follow. Jesus truly died on the Cross on Good Friday and the Bible stories of the events that followed confirm that he came truly alive again. He met with his disciples, he ate meals – even cooked one at least – and yet he was different. Jesus had not merely been resuscitated - come out of a coma as it were. For if that had been the case he would simply live to die again at some later date. No, his was a different sort of life: at one moment entirely physical, touchable, and at another moment he would simply vanish from sight. But this miracle, for that is what it was, is only part of the story. It raises questions. We can readily understand the events of Good Friday and Easter Sunday on the surface. We know all about unfair trials resulting in innocent people being convicted - and that is what happened to Jesus. Similarly, although some do struggle with the concept of miracles, we can accept that Jesus was dead but is now alive. But underneath the surface there is so much more to these events. It is a fundamental of Christian faith that we believe that Jesus died for our sins which through the faith that we have in him means that we can be in a sin free relationship with God. Sin separated humankind from God and led to death. Jesus has taken all our sins then, now and in the future and freed us from perpetual death. Those who die in the faith of Jesus can be assured of life everlasting. Alleluia! Christ is Risen from the dead!

Turning to our programme on SPIRITUALITY we have two talks coming up. The first is on Saturday 2nd April at the Parish Hall at Edington from 4pm to approximately 6pm. It will be in the form of a workshop led by the Revd Colin Coward MBE on prayer, not just the Christian understanding of prayer, but exploring prayer through silence, stillness, meditation and awareness. Prayer is not just asking God for things that we feel are important to us but also of reaching an awareness of the presence of God. The second is on Saturday 30th April at Edington Priory Church again between 4 and 6pm. Led by the Revd Andrew Ashdown it is called 'Voices from Syria'. We can hear at first hand of all that is going on in that troubled part of God's world and how the Christians still living there are continuing to work out their faith. How does their spirituality cope with physical and mental pressures they are facing in their everyday lives. The situation is so terrible that this will be a wonderful opportunity to hear from someone who has so recently been there, in the love and peace of Christ.





WILTSHIRE CITIZENS ADVICE CLEARS UP PENSION JARGON BAFFLING CONSUMERS

"Flexi-access drawdown", "open market option" and "safeguarded benefits" are some of the pension terms most confusing for consumers, reveals Wiltshire Citizens Advice The local charity, which delivers face to face Pension Wise appointments in Wiltshire, South Gloucestershire, Bristol and Bath says people would find it easier to understand their pensions if the industry used simple, standard language to describe their products.

Some people are also unclear about terms which appear to be more straightforward, putting them at risk of missing out on the best pension options for them. For example; staff have reported cases where consumers wrongly believed that their 'selected retirement date' was set in stone as the date they could access their pension, when in fact they could have accessed their savings ahead of this date.

To help people get to grips with their pension, Pension Wise guiders have identified the pensions jargon which people find most perplexing and have explained them in simple terms.

Recent research from national Citizens Advice shows more than a quarter of people with defined contribution pensions feel that they don't understand their pension plan, while fewer than one in five feel very confident.

Albert Ball, Pension Wise Project Manager said: "Pension decisions can be hard enough without having to translate tricky wording. Many people coming to visit us are mystified by the jargon being used and our staff are here to help clear up the confusing language. Having a better understanding of what the terms mean puts consumers on a better path to choosing a retirement option which suits them."

EDINGTON & DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB FIRST THURSDAY IN THE MONTH PARISH HALL 7.30PM

Spring is here and its official! It is warm enough now to spend some time enjoying what bulbs there are and making notes of where new ones need to go for next year's display. We are at last beginning to believe we will be able to work, sit and eat in the garden for another summer, after a long wet autumn and winter.

Our last speaker at Gardening Club got us off to a good start by reminding us of the wonderful job done by the bees that visit our gardens. Claire Barker from local company Hive Originals gave us a crash course in bee-keeping and the benefits of honey and beeswax. Not only was she really informative (who knew there were 224 types of bees in the UK?) but also inspiring. Only one bee works all year – the honeybee. In a hive, one queen can live for 7 years, but the workers for less than 6 weeks. The workers are all females, who clean, forage, guard and feed the queen and generally make a home. Sound familiar? The drones are the males and their job is to fly and mate with a virgin queen. They all die by winter, but at its peak the hive averages 100,000 busy bees.

Claire showed us waxed honeycomb and honey and told us how it is all made and extracted, with each product having a specific use. From pollen, to propolis, royal jelly, beeswax, honeycomb and honey, all are beneficial because of their anti-bacterial, antifungal, anti-inflammatory and anti-oxidant propertiesand of course the delicious taste of the honey.

Claire started her business so that she could make a living from her bees. She works with a laboratory and has spent many thousands of pounds developing an all-natural product range and in August 2013 she launched her business selling creams, lotions and balms. We were able to test her delicious-smelling products and members bought some at the end of the event. I can recommend the night cream, which smells great, is non-greasy and with none of the ingredients that cause problems for the environment and for our bodies.

Our next Club evening is on Thursday 7th April (7.30 pm), when Nicky Gilbert will be talking about dahlias. Do come along for coffee, cake, friendship and really useful gardening information. 



In my article in last month's magazine, I mentioned how the budget in Wiltshire Council is spent and drew a distinction between the funds allocated to protect our vulnerable residents (£179m) and what is spent on our roads and waste collection etc (£150m). Having just seen the delivery of the latest Budget from the Government and the announcement of yet further cuts to public spending, we know that local government will no doubt be squeezed even more. Therefore we need to be certain that our funds are spent wisely.

Looking at this point, during the weekend of 5 & 6 March, many communities went out and collected litter for the 'Clean for the Queen' initiative. Across the county and indeed the country, verges, parks, paths and roads were cleared of litter through the dedication and hard work of very many residents, of all ages. Bags of litter were cleared and our villages look better for this. The question though is who and why was this litter deposited in the first place? I don't know about you, I wouldn't dream of throwing anything from my car, instead I take it home. But as we drive along many roads, the verges are strewn with litter and this is often fast food wrappers and cans and bottles and to be clear, this is a nationwide problem. I find this makes me angry that our beautiful county is being desecrated by individuals who have no social responsibility or conscience. Therefore let me return to the funding issue. Wiltshire Council presently spends £2m a year on litter picking, which is over and above what communities already do. Our main roads are dangerous places to operate and volunteers cannot be engaged in this way. Therefore properly trained and equipped people have to do this. This £2m comes out of the £150m I discussed above and is 1.33% of this amount. I hope you agree a significant amount of money!

Before writing this article this morning, I was copied into an email from an irate Town Councillor in Westbury complaining that Wiltshire Council was abrogating its responsibilities over litter picking. We all have our points of view but frankly greater efforts need to be directed into educating people to cease throwing litter out in the first place, rather than allocating more and more scarce funds to this issue. Otherwise it is treating the symptoms rather than finding a cure. There needs to be a drive from central Government akin to the recent successful charging for bags in supermarkets, which has shown an 80% reduction in use. I intend writing to our MP, Dr Andrew Murrison about this matter.
