Christmas is coming. It's the season of goodwill, and all that!

Except, as I write this, the mood is not exactly festive. The terrorist attacks in Paris have taken place and, for the time being, the f-word is fear, not fun. Dozens of families will have to get through the holiday season without their loved ones.

Such was the scale of the murderous outrage that I am sure it will still be in the front of our minds when you are reading this. Feelings of helplessness and impotence in the face of that malignancy may remain.

There are precedents to such events. 22 years ago the IRA exploded an enormous bomb in Bishopsgate destroying a part of London where my wife and I had both worked until only a few months before. Life in London carried on and now there is peace, more or less, in Northern Ireland.

In the 1970s the Baader Meinhoff group and the Red Army Faction conducted a series of terrorist attacks in West Germany. Remember them?

In 1913, the suffragettes exploded a bomb that partially destroyed Lloyd George's house, yet now we look rather kindly on Mrs Pankhurst.

No one now has even heard of the Sheffield Outrages, a series of explosions and murders by a small group of trade unionist militants carried out in the 1860s. They had a just cause in objecting to conditions in the steel industry but took their actions a little too far.

None of this makes the current situation any happier but I hope history allows us to put

current events into context. The wartime message resonates now: Keep Calm and Carry on.

I hope you have a safe and happy Christmas.







#### POLICE WARNING

Police are urging people to be vigilant after a spate of frauds where people in Wiltshire have been tricked into handing over large amounts of money to criminals posing as police officers. Two women from Wiltshire were recently targeted and duped into travelling to London and handing over tens of thousands of pounds and valuable goods to fraudsters. These cases are the latest in a spate of recent incidents where members of the public, sometimes vulnerable elderly people, have been tricked by scammers.

We would urge people to be cautious when speaking to people over the phone who claim to be from the police, the bank or any other body.

- A genuine police officer or bank official will **NEVER** ask you to reveal personal financial details, about your account over the phone.
- They will **NEVER** ask you to withdraw or transfer money to different accounts or and deliver money to them at a named location.
- A real police officer or bank official will not mind you checking them out. However ALWAYS hang up your phone and use a different phone either mobile, friends or neighbours if necessary to make a call to 101 or to your local bank branch. The suspect will hold your landline open leading you to believe that you are dialling out when actually they are still there.- Never allow the person to transfer you.
- If you have any reservations about the call put the phone down.



I wanted to take this opportunity to say a big "Thank you" to all who have supported, whether by deeds, words or prayers, me and Susan over the last 12 months, from the diagnosis of breast cancer last November through to her death on the 15th October. 



- Where to go for help with applying for Attendance Allowance



#### SALISBURY PLAIN TRAINING AREA DECEMBER 2015 NEWSLETTER

The Army Weapons Effect Simulation Exercise WESSEX STORM for 4th Battalion The Rifles in the mechanised infantry role run by the Field Training Unit which started on 21 November will continue until 7 December. This exercise which involves the use of Mastiff and Jackal wheeled armoured vehicle, will be supported by armoured, armoured cavalry, armoured infantry, and armoured engineer sub-units. They are joined by a foreign force infantry company from Oman making this the largest exercise on Salisbury Plain this year. The public should be aware that tank crossings over the A360, A345, A338, B390, and the C22 (Tilshead to Chitterne) roads will be very busy and in the current wet conditions mud clearance parties will be working on the crossings. Drivers are advised to exercise caution when passing all tank crossings on the Plain. Notice is also given that the training areas in the Copehill Down and Bourne Valley (SPTA East) areas will be heavily used over this period and that recreational use of the Salisbury Plain military lands is to be restricted to public rights of way only as per the byelaws.

The week 1-5 December will see extensive live mortar and artillery firing on the Larkhill Ranges as Ex CROSSED CANNONS marks the end of four major artillery courses. The remainder of the month will be very quite in the run up to Christmas and New Year with only low level training being conducted.

#### News from your Wiltshire Councillor - Jerry Wickham

At the end of another year we have the opportunity to reflect on what has been achieved this year and meet the challenges ahead.

There is great activity amongst councillor colleagues as well as officers in County Hall, trying to prepare a balanced budget for presentation to the Council in February.

Austerity clearly is here to stay and this means that we need to identify further efficiencies on how we provide services in the county. We also understand that a number of central government departments have agreed to reduce their budgets by 30% in the next four years – one of which it is understood is the Department Communities and Local Government, which in effect provides the grant to Wiltshire. We believe that this grant will again reduce and therefore it is prudent for us to reflect on this and begin making the necessary plans to meet this challenge. In simple terms, this means doing more with less and also trying to protect our front line services. We also have to look after the vulnerable in Wiltshire's society as well as maintaining those services used by the rest of the rate paying population.

As we move into 2016, I remain determined to ensure Wiltshire Council's highways team stick to their agreed timeframe for repairing the B3098. This is due to start towards the end of January through into early February and provided we have no inclement weather, I expect this to begin on time since these repairs are long overdue. Equally, all of the parishes along this road have sought for there to be a review of the types and weights of vehicles driving through the villages. Fellow Wiltshire Council colleagues and parish councils will contribute to this review, but there must be realism that many farms and villages will still be served by large vehicles, should any review suggest amendments to the categories of vehicles using the road.




