The money already deposited totalled £3,118.65, this being the proceeds from around the Gig in the garden, held back in September.


This was an amazing effort and the family would again wish to thank the @Gig@ committee and everyone who supported the event to make is the success it was.



Responding to Violence

As I write this article, events have just occurred in Paris which are deeply shocking. Murder has come to the streets, once again, of a Western capital. The impact of what is going on will surely be felt for years to come, even after the specifics have perhaps become fuzzy memories. Unfortunately, the danger with writing a topical article is that by the time you get to read this, another incident may, by then, have occurred.

I have been reading the Qur'an this week, to confirm to myself that what is written in its pages is very far removed from what appears to be in the minds of the terrorists. We have all been deeply moved, I'm sure, by all that we have heard from Nigeria, France and so many other places, and I'm sure that we are all equally concerned about reactions against innocent Moslems as a consequence.

I'm not an expert on Islam, but as far as I can tell, the Qur'an only allows its adherents to kill in self-defence, or in the defence of those who are themselves being attacked (4:75): but even then there are important caveats which define these narrow circumstances precisely.

Once again, it is how a text is interpreted, or rather misinterpreted, that causes the problems. Throughout the history of Christianity and Judaism there have also been similar problems where texts have been misinterpreted, by accident or by design. Indeed, Jesus seems to spend a huge amount of his time in the Gospel accounts correcting the misinterpretations of the Pharisees and the Sadducees.

This is a time when all peoples of faith need to stand together in common cause and in condemnation of terrorism: all the holy books unequivocally condemn attacks upon the innocent. The asymmetry of resources between western nations and extremists might mean that there cannot be 'conventional' war between combatants on either side, but this does not, in any way, justify terrorist attacks upon the innocent.

About 15 years ago I was working in a school based in a small village. Residents were able to come in and use the photocopier. One day a teenage girl came in and wanted to photocopy a large quantity of materials to distribute at her local place of worship. These materials were of the sort that today we would recognise as being provocative or could ultimately lead vulnerable people to radicalisation. As I was at pains to point out to her, in refusing to allow her to photocopy them, there is a difference between freedom of expression and stirring up hatred. I suppose that my words were water off a duck's back, at the time, and perhaps only the passing of time would help her to see things differently. But I do still think that it is important for all of us to challenge hatred and

violence whenever we encounter it, and in whatever form it takes.



The Dorothy House Foundation was set up in 1976, based at the Bath home of its founder Prue Dufour (formerly Clench). She saw a need for care of terminally ill patients in their community, rather than in hospital.

Inspired by the example of St Christopher's Hospice - which had been set up in London nine years earlier by Dame Cicely Saunders - Prue drew together a small team of nurses who supported people at home. She chose the name Dorothy House for the charity as a reflection of her Christian faith - Dorothy means 'gift of God'. In 1979, Dorothy House opened its first In-Patient Unit for six people at 162 Bloomfield Road, Bath. By the 1990's the buildings in Bloomfield Road were bursting at the seams, and in 1995 the move to Winsley took place.

All their services in the community and the hospice are provided free of charge and with equal access to all. Their aim is to offer physical, psychological, social and spiritual care to patients and their families facing life threatening illness, death or bereavement, who have specific problems which need specialist skills. In partnership with all others involved, they focus on quality of life, respecting the uniqueness of each person and their family. They seek to promote the development of palliative care through education of others and research.



THE FOUR VILLAGES LINK is a registered charity scheme that provides assistance to people in our community through a dedicated group of about 40 volunteers. We can provide transport to and from appointments as well as help with a variety of practical tasks. Many of the transport requests are for journeys to local doctors' and dentists' surgeries although we do undertake trips to hospitals further away. We also offer assistance with small practical household tasks and we even have a wheelchair that can be loaned out on a short term basis.

TFVL is one of 45 support schemes in Wiltshire staffed by volunteers and anyone, of any age or ability can make use of the scheme for almost anything, and in this way we can help to improve the quality of life for residents in our community. Whilst the LINK supports and complements local health and social services it is able to operate at a far more personal level and, for your peace of mind, all our volunteers are CRB checked and carry identity badges. So, if you would like help just call us on **07852 256 939**between 9am—6pm Monday to Friday and one of our duty coordinators will log your request and find a volunteer to help you. All calls are charged at mobile rates. Responding to requests can be demanding so it helps to receive plenty of notice when being asked to organise assistance, ideally not less than 48 hours in advance.

Visiting the RUH in Bath

If you need to visit the RUH in Bath then please use the Wiltshire Hopper Bus if at all possible. This is a bookable service, operating Monday to Friday at affordable rates, (if you are a bus pass holder then the return journey is only £8). The return service leaves the RUH on an hourly basis at half past the hour. Wheelchair access is available on the Hopper. To make your booking call 08456-525255 (then select Option 2) by 10:00 the day before you wish to travel. Further details can be found at: www.wiltshire.gov.uk/connect2wilts-ruh-hopper.pdf. The success of the LINK scheme is purely down to the continuing support of our volunteers and, with an increasing population of older people, together with the decline in locally funded services, it is inevitable that we will be called upon more frequently to offer assistance. 



THE UNIVERSITY OF THE THIRD AGE

Around 40 members met in the United Reformed Church Hall on 13th January to hear Elizabeth Gowing, her topic Edith & I: On the Trail of An Edwardian Traveller in Kosovo. As a teacher in Hackney Elizabeth taught some refugee children and was thrilled when her partner was offered a contract to act as an advisor to the prime minister of Kosovo.



Fascinated by the local customs, a mix derived from both Serbia and Albania, she was soon asking questions of her local friends and guides, on several occasions receiving the comment "What are you, AyDIT DourHAM" Persevering Elizabeth discovered that Edith Durham was a wealthy English lady who had travelled to the Baltics as a health cure, fallen in love with the area and thereafter spent as much time as possible travelling in Kosovo and the nearby states. At first this was for two months each year, the remainder being spent nursing her sick mother.

After her mother's death she lived in Kosovo for some years. Although at first reputed to be a man in disguise or the King of England's sister, Edith eventually became a loved and respected member of the local community. Many streets are named after her and there is a memorial to her in the mountains, erected after her death at the age of 80 in 1944.




She did in fact run a hospital during the Balkan War, and continued to support the local communities even writing to the Guardian in 1927 asking that people shop in a particular shop which had imported goods for sale. Elizabeth feels she is following in Edith's footsteps having founded a charity six years ago which enables local women to sell bags they have produced, and keep all profits as long as their children go to school.

It is a huge tribute to our immensely talented staff that we are able to reach these targets. And we are extremely lucky to work with such aspirational and dedicated children and their families.

MORE IMPORTANTLY...

Although academic success is extremely important, we are always just as delighted with other aspects of our children's education and development. A Message from Richard Gamble

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division



Money seems to feature rather highly as a subject for consideration at this time of year.

At one level you are (perhaps that should be "I am") coping with the costs of Christmas which, like most good causes, does not come cheap.

At another level, you may have just submitted your tax return and HMRC could be smiling at receipt of more of your hardearned cash.

It can be tough for businesses too. If you are a retailer, this is when you have to pay the suppliers of stock you may or may not have sold in the pre- or post-Christmas rush.

Money features equally large in the mind of the public sector, although the chemistry is slightly different. Public sector budgets work strictly to an annual cycle that runs (to all intents and purposes) from April in one year to March in the next year. As a general rule, any allocated funds not spent by the end of March cannot be carried over to the following year, so some public institutions may be found to be fairly extravagant in this season. I am an admirer of Prudence but, sadly, she sometime goes on holiday at this time of year.

Of course, Wiltshire Council cannot be accused of extravagance and has saved some £100m of expenditure in the past few years by judicious management and without significant loss of services. The miracle is that we have done this while keeping Council Tax unchanged for 5 years. This represents a saving over the period of £782 pounds for a Band D property. So when you look at your bank statement, please consider how much worse it could have been if Wiltshire Council had not tightened its own belt over the period.

More savings must be made in the year ahead and Wiltshire Council is now discussing the budget for 2015/16. We must tighten the belt by a further £30 million, which will be tough but not impossible.

The public sector is sometimes accused of being flabby and self-indulgent but there is no doubt in my mind that financial discipline has made Wiltshire Council more fit for purpose. I only wish my own personal regime had been as effective in improving my physique!

NEWS FROM YOUR WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR **IERRY WICKHAM**

I would like to start of by wishing you a happy new year - even if it is February now! In Wiltshire Council, we have a busy period ahead of us over the next few months with a series of full meetings of the entire Council, in order to ensure we are able to carry on providing services across the county.

At the time of writing this article we are almost at the eve of an extraordinary meeting with the sole business being the adoption of Wiltshire's Core Strategy. No doubt many readers might be asking why this is so important. Essentially, this strategy becomes the bedrock of all of our planning policies relative to where new homes are built, dealing with employment centres in the county, enhancements of our transport routes and how each of the respective areas in Wiltshire will develop. The new strategy brings this right up to date and is designed to serve the county in 2026.

We also have the very important issue this month of formulating a budget for the next year. This has to be seen against the backdrop of increasing demand but with a shrinking grant from central government. As Councillors, we have to produce a balanced budget against what has been roughly a 10% cut, year on year in central government funding for some time now. I remain confident that we will ensure our roads get repaired, our libraries remain open, our leisure centres continue to run and most importantly our most vulnerable residents continue to receive the help that they need.

Locally in Coulston, the roads will continue to be monitored to prevent contractors' vehicles from the solar farm using the village itself and in Edington the work by BT, in conjunction with Wiltshire Council, should bring super-fast broadband. In my home village of Keevil, we have recently seen the broadband speed increase ten fold!

Thanks to the generosity of some of the residents and businesses of Edington plus a grant from the Area Board we have been able to order the swings for the playing field. These should be in place by the end of January. Thank you very much to all those who have made this possible.

Nobody can have failed to notice the road works that have plagued the village during January. While disruptive, the good news is they have been laying fibre optic cables, which will enable faster broadband to be delivered in a few months. The cable is owned by BT, but like your current telephone and current broad band services, you will have to sign up to it through a commercial company. Households will hopefully be notified when the service goes Live.


Our December meeting was very enjoyable with good company, good food (thanks Wendy), and a couple of quizzes.


