



If you would like help just call us on 07852 256 939 between 9am -6pm Monday to Friday and one of our duty coordinators will log your request and find a volunteer to help you. All calls are charged at mobile rates. Responding to requests can be demanding so it really helps to receive plenty of notice when being asked to organise assistance, ideally not less than 48 hours in advance.

VISITING THE RUH IN BATH

You may have seen in the local press that the Wiltshire Hopper Bus service will be withdrawn some time in May but it is still operating at the moment so, if you need to visit the RUH in Bath, then please use this bus if at all possible.

This is a bookable service, operating Monday to Friday at affordable rates, (if you are a bus pass holder then the return journey is only £8). The return service leaves the RUH on an hourly basis at half past the hour. Wheelchair access is available on the Hopper.

To make your booking call 08456 525255 (then select Option 2) by 10.00am the day before you wish to travel. Further details can be found at www.wiltshire.gov.uk/connect2wilts-ruh-hopper.pdf.

TFVL is one of many support schemes in Wiltshire staffed by volunteers and anyone, of any age or ability can make use of it. Whilst LINK supports and complements local health and social services it is able to operate at a far more personal level and, for your peace of mind, all our volunteers are CRB checked and carry identity badges.

However, the success of the scheme is purely down to the continuing support of our volunteers and, with an increasing population of older people, together with the decline in funding services locally, it is inevitable that we will be called upon more frequently to offer assistance. For instance, during December our dedicated, but dwindling, group of

volunteers responded to 31 requests but unfortunately we were unable to fulfil all of them.

We are always looking for new volunteers to help with our requests, connecting our clients with appropriate volunteers or serving on our Management Committee. WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR BACKS VILLAGE IN FIGHT FOR PUB

Villagers and the local community made it very clear to Wiltshire planners that they want the George & Dragon in Erlestoke to remain a pub. **I 35 people** signed a petition taken round the village. Wiltshire Council's planning application page was swamped by over 61 objection letters and emails. Wiltshire Councillor Richard Gamble is backing the villagers' efforts.

The campaign to buy the pub for the village is being run by The Erlestoke Hub Ltd., a limited company set up to purchase the pub on behalf of the local community. The pub is subject to an 'Asset of Community Value' order, which provided six months for the community to put forward an offer. The Group made an offer at valuation price, within the six months period, which was turned down by the owners. This situation has infuriated the group — and the village. "We are doing all we can to support the local community in their desire for the pub to remain open," says Keith Lewcock, Chairman of the Erlestoke Hub Ltd. "Many people are up in arms about a section of the owners' planning application report that seems to suggest a deal with the Planning Officer."

The supplementary report accompanying the most recent planning application for change of use mentions: "The Council agreed the specific wording on the marketing details and recommended that the property be offered at a figure "in the region of £320,000."

"The Council's Planning Officer stated that: 'At the end of the six months' marketing period and the six months' ACV moratorium period I will be able to recommend that planning permission be granted if ... the property has been marketed at a realistic price (which you are now proposing) and no realistic offer have been put forward for the purchase of the property."

The Erlestoke Hub Ltd. believes that they have put forward a realistic offer backed up by a valuation survey that priced the pub at £250,000. They have been offered no alternative evidence, either by the owners or the Wiltshire Planning Officer, for the much higher price. "This is outrageous," says Keith Lewcock. "For the Planning Officer to suggest such a high valuation – and a completely unjustified one – and then to say that planning will be granted if no offers at that level are received, does not seem to be playing fair."

Wiltshire Councillor Richard Gamble is supporting the village in their battle. He has already made a request for the Planning Application to go before the planning committee, whatever the Planning Officer decides. On the application he mentions: "This property was registered as an asset of community interest and a fair offer has been made by the community. The offer has, apparently, been rejected, which appears to bring the process into disrepute."

He has also said in an email to the Erlestoke Hub Ltd.: "I am very impressed indeed with the quality and the breadth of the community's response on this matter. I have briefed Claire Perry (MP for Devizes) on the matter, and the apparent gap in legislation in England that seems to hamper community asset purchases like this. She is willing to take it up with the relevant minister (and may already have done so)."







At this time of year, for many in the public sector, the mind is focussed on money. Wiltshire Council, for example, will decide in February what level of council tax to set for the coming financial year that runs from April 2016 to March 2017. Although the figures are not yet determined, we know that the grant from government will again fall by a significant amount. Just like you, local government must balance its expenditure against its income so all departments across the council are yet again considering where savings can be made. The task of deciding where to spend money is often not a matter of free choice. Many of the tasks undertaken by local government are laid down by statute and are thus obligations that cannot be avoided.

For example, any child that lives more than 3 miles from its designated school (2 miles for the under-eights) is entitled to free transport to that school. In a rural county like Wiltshire, that involves moving many thousands of children many miles every school day. The total cost over the year runs into several million pounds. It is a cost that cannot be avoided, although you may agree that it is spent in a good cause.

The council also spends several million pounds on supporting rural bus services. In this case, however, there is no obligation to do so. One such subsidised service is Wilts and Dorset service 2 between Devizes and Salisbury. In contrast, the X72 to Devizes and Bath is commercial and operates without subsidy. Wiltshire Council is consulting on where savings can be made and, if you are a bus user, I urge you to take part. Details can be found here <code>www.wiltshire.gov.uk/news/articles/bus-service-consultation</code>. Wiltshire Council also spends money on traffic management. You would think that painting a yellow line to control parking or moving a speed limit sign to a better position would be cheap and simple tasks. Indeed, the cost of actually painting the line or moving the sign is negligible. But the bureaucratic procedure required to issue a Traffic Regulation Order costs several thousand pounds, so the council is generally very reluctant to undertake these otherwise simple tasks.

Such examples are not uncommon. Therefore, if local government is to find the money to support good causes like rural bus services, a reduction in the burden of unnecessary, bureaucratic regulations would be a great help. LOVE - ACTUALLY

Christmas has come and gone and the next major Festival in our Church calendar is Easter which this year is the 27th March, the 2nd earliest in 15 years. But before that in February we have the start of Lent, a period of preparation for the events of Good Friday when we recall the death of Jesus by crucifixion; and his glorious resurrection on Easter Day. It is for Christians a time of prayer and fasting – which is where we get the idea of "giving up something for Lent". But I am not going to push that one in this note!

What I will focus on is the 14th February – Valentine's Day which gets its name from St. Valentine. During the year we celebrate the lives of various Saints but sadly St Valentine does seem to be over- looked – possibly because there is some uncertainty as to precisely who he was and possibly because his day has been overtaken somewhat by cards, gifts and romantic meals for 2, for love is in the air.

So who was St Valentine? It seems he did exist but he may have been one of three contenders. There was Valentine martyred in Rome about 269/270 and the Pope about 200 years later declared 14th February as his day. It is said he was a priest and that despite the then Emperor's orders that he should not marry people, he continued to do so maintaining that it was part of God's plan and purpose for the world. He was eventually jailed and beheaded but not before he fell in love with the jailer's daughter, sending her a note on the evening of his execution which read: "from your Valentine". It is the stuff of legend!

Of the other 2 one was Bishop of Terni and the other was martyred in Africa, but neither it seems has a telling story attached to them. Indeed such is the mystery surrounding them that our first hero is perhaps the same as the second.

And why has this day become what it is? Well, the legend suggests that Valentine, apart from sending the first Valentine's card, was marrying couples in the name of love, and that reminds us of God's love for us, of Jesus' love for his bride, the church – that's us, all who believe in him – and the love that we should have for God and one another.

St. Valentine's Day falls on a Sunday this year. It is my hope and prayer that we celebrate Valentine and use it as an opportunity to rededicate ourselves to loving God and our friends, relations and neighbours. That is our calling for God is love. That is love — love, actually. And if we do, we will change the world. May the love of God, the peace of Christ and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you

The Parish Council would like to wish everyone a belated Happy New Year. The turning on of the Christmas tree lights was very well supported with some hearty carol singing and we would like to thank the Three Daggers for providing the tree and the refreshments, most welcome on a cool December evening.

At our meeting in January we had a lengthy discussion setting the budget for the coming year and the end result was that due to a number of factors, including a reduction in the grant we receive from Wiltshire Council we have had to implement a small increase in the precept to cover our expected costs in maintaining the village assets. The Parish Council will of course do everything within its powers to keep costs to a minimum whilst retaining the current level of provision.

As part of the Queens 90th birthday celebrations there are plans for a nationwide Tidy Up on the weekend of March 4th – 6th and Edington will be doing its part by encouraging villagers to tidy up their part of the village, we will give more details in next month's edition of the News and on the village website.

The planned roadworks on the B3098 between Westbury and West Lavington, are provisionally scheduled to take place between 21st March and 8th April 2016 and it is anticipated that the road will be closed for at least some of the time, we will provide further information when we receive it in the meantime information above planned roadworks can be found on the Wiltshire Council website. There will also be roadworks in Salisbury Hollow from 2nd March to 4th April to enable Wiltshire Council to repair and resurface the road, this will also involve some restrictions at the bottom of Long Hollow.

BT have now completed the upgrading of the broadband provision for the village and this means that should you wish you can now receive high speed broadband to your property. As part of this upgrade, the speed of "ordinary" broadband has also increased significantly and in theory, we can receive up to 18Mbps. To receive the high-speed broadband you will need to contact your provider who should be able to transfer you, at a cost, to the higher speed facility.

Finally can we renew our plea to dog owners to clear up after their animals as the Parish Council has received a number of complaints especially recently in the Court Lane,

Baynton Way and Little Court Lane area along with the field between the Three Daggers and the Church.







Wiltshire Council entered into a partnership with Community First in 2010, this partnership comes to an end in April 2016. The decision has been made not to renew this partnership but to work differently and facilitate local wellbeing through the county's area boards.

A Wiltshire Council spokesperson said: "Protecting those who feel isolated and lonely is a key priority for us. We asked older people what kind of services they felt should be available within their community and, based on this feedback, we have decided to provide this service in a different way.

"Our local area boards sit right at the heart of our communities and are ideally placed to provide and coordinate this new way of working. The new approach will build on the success of existing networks and links the area boards have. This will ensure local people connect with the resources and services they need to improve their wellbeing and help them remain independent within their community."

"We would also like to acknowledge the work that the Good Neighbour

Co-ordinators and Community First have delivered over the last five years. This work has contributed significantly to our understanding of the support that vulnerable and older people across Wiltshire need."



We rounded off the year with two special events in December. Firstly our annual Christmas Supper with wonderful food, (thank you Wendy), some quizzes and a raffle. We had great fun. Secondly our final trip of the year to Westonbirt Arboretum where the trees were dressed in a beautiful lighting display and choristers sang to us. We decorated pine cones, drank hot chocolate and mulled wine (not together!) and had a lovely festive time. It

actually stopped raining for our whole trip - the only time in days. 

SALISBURY PLAIN - FEBRUARY 2016 NEWSLETTER

The month of February will start with the continuation of the Field Training Unit organised Army Weapons Effect Simulation Exercise WESSEX STORM for 2nd Battalion The Yorkshire Regiment in the light protective mobility infantry role which will use extensive areas across the Plain. This exercise will involve the use of Foxhound and Husky wheeled armoured vehicles and will be supported by elements of a light cavalry sqaudron in CVRT. They will be joined by a foreign force infantry company. The public should be aware that tank crossings over the A360, A345, A338, B390, and the C22 (Tilshead to Chitterne) roads will be very busy and if conditions are wet mud clearance parties will be working on the crossings. Notice is also given that the training areas in the Copehill Down and Bourne Valley (SPTA East) areas will be heavily used over this period and that recreational use of the Salisbury Plain military lands in these areas are to be restricted to public rights of way only as per the byelaws. The exercise will end on 11 February.

During the remainder of the month the majority of training will involve armoured formations conducting low level sub-unit training across all areas with elements of armoured (Challenger 2), armoured infantry (Warrior), armoured cavalry (CVRT), armoured engineers, and signals regiments plus light mechanised troops.

The last two weeks of the month will see 1 Intelligence Surveillance and Recconnaissance Brigade conducting Exercise STEEL SABRE involving live firing on the Larkhill Impact Area.

ACCESS

Access to SPTA is regulated by Salisbury Plain Military Lands, Bulford, Larkhill and Imber Range Byelaws. Always comply with local signs and flags. Rights of way in Range Danger Areas are closed when red flags are flying.



News from your Wiltshire Councillor – Jerry Wickham

In Wiltshire Council, the next few months are a busy period for us with the important meeting of the entire Council in February to formulate and agree the budget for the next year. Year on year, the grant from central government reduces and the demand for services increases which means there is a widening gap.

In the autumn statement, the Chancellor of the Exchequer announced how councils could raise the council tax, without penalty, by 2% provided this was dedicated to adult social care. Wiltshire as a county already has a larger than average proportion of older residents, so any increase in resources will be welcomed. However, it is each and every one of us as council tax payers, who end up footing this bill and therefore these resources must be spent wisely. Despite this, we still have to continue to find more innovative and cost effective ways of delivering services and sometimes this means that these will change. I do remain confident that we will ensure our roads get repaired, our libraries remain open, our leisure centres continue to run and most importantly our most vulnerable residents continue to receive the help that they need.

I am reliably advised that repairs and resurfacing of the B3098 will commence at the end of March through into April. Road closure orders will be prepared shortly and will advise us where and when the works will take place. In effect the entire length of the road, certainly from Westbury through to the A360 at Littleton Panell will have sections repaired. This is very long overdue!

I am also pleased that the community at Edington will be able to begin developing a Neighbourhood Plan for the parish. This will enable the community to have a real say on the future development of the village albeit will take time to develop.




