Edington charity of the month August - Christian Hope International.

Christian Hope International was born out of the pain and suffering that occurred during the Rwandan genocide in Central Africa in 1994. It seeks to bring the true hope along with practical support to those in need in Africa and Eastern Europe.

Working in partnership with the Christian Community in the 'Developing World' they seek to provide practical aid, resourcing small community projects and enabling children to receive a good education through child sponsorship. Westbury & District U3A

Those gathered in the United Reformed Church hall this month heard a fascinating talk about Monkey World. Mike Colbourne, or Monkey Mike as he often referred to, worked at both Chester and Bristol Zoos before joining Monkey World over 20 years ago. The sanctuary, 65 acres, which is situated in the Dorset countryside near Wareham first opened in 1987. Initially Monkey World was intended to provide a home for abused chimpanzees used as props by Spanish beach photographers, but is now home to several species of primate.

The rescued chimps undergo medical checks and rehabilitation before being introduced to one of the four social groups living in one of the large enclosures. Mike told the individual stories of several of the chimps, showing in some cases the pictures taken on their arrival and after rehabilitation. The centre does not intentionally breed from the chimps; the females being on the contraceptive pill, but "accidents" do happen and it is sometimes necessary to hand rear the babies as the mothers may be unable to look after their offspring. The other animals include orang-utans, woolly monkeys and gibbons and Monkey World has a successful breeding programme for all of these. Mike told the story of Gordon the orang-utan, who was born a month prematurely at the centre in December 1997. He spent his first few weeks in an incubator, cared for by Mike and the other staff. Pictures were shown of Gordon in his incubator and some of him as an adult who now has a son of his own.

Mike stressed that the purpose of the sanctuary was to house the animals that they care for in the best possible manner. To this end the enclosures are very large and visitors sometimes find it more difficult to see the animals than at zoos. However with a bit of patience the animals can be seen in an environment very near that of their natural habitat. The next monthly meeting is on July 12 when the speaker will talk about military medals. Newcomers are always welcome, we meet at the United Reformed Church Hall, starting at 2pm.



Do you want some good news for a change?

Wiltshire has a thriving and growing economy. Only 0.6% of the working age population is claiming Job Seekers Allowance, which is about half the national figure. Not bad, I'd say! Schools are doing well. Over 90% of our children are being educated in schools that are rated Good or Outstanding by Ofsted, which puts Wiltshire very nearly at the top of the national list. The proportion of students getting GCSE Grade A*-C including English & Maths is well above the national average.

Another positive point is that, on average, men and women in Wiltshire live in good health for longer than those in other parts of England.

But when more of us reach old age we may need more help. Wiltshire Council's Adult Care Services have supported 26,483 individuals between April 2015 and March 2016. This includes residents who received both long term and short term support. Help to live at home is designed to help people who are frail, sick or disabled live at home for as long as it is safe and it helps people to continue to look after themselves in their own home.

To help the environment, waste diverted from landfill continues to exceed the target of 75%. Landfill = Bad. Recycling = Good. Please keep it up!

Less happily, the number of incidents of fly-tipping increased by 22% over the year. Actions to reduce the number of incidents include increased camera surveillance and increased joint working operations with the Police to intercept waste which is being transported illegally. In addition, the Council will make full use of the new fixed penalty notice (introduced in May 2016) as an added deterrent to would-be fly tippers.

Support for local communities last year came in the form of grants from Area Boards, which totalled £1.7 million, supporting 1,038 local projects. For every £1 of grants an additional £4.53 was leveraged from other sources so the total investment in Wiltshire communities totalled over £5.7 million.

By the time you are reading this the nation will have decided its future with Europe. Whichever way it has gone bridges will need to be built for there have been significant differences between members of both major parties and both Government and Opposition will need to regroup in order to function effectively. We will be holding them all in our prayers.

These months we continue each Sunday looking at Jesus' life through the writing of Luke, but we also have the celebration of 3 important people in the story of Jesus – James and Bartholomew and Mary Magdalene and one event that is seen as most significant. This last is on the 6th August when we celebrate the Transfiguration.

But first James. Known as St James the Great he is the Patron Saint of Bratton Church celebrated on the 25th July and was one of the close inner circle of Jesus' disciples. He was one of the leaders of the early church in Jerusalem and was martyred for his faith in Jesus Christ about 12 years after Jesus' death and resurrection. He was 'put to death with the sword' which suggests that he was in fact beheaded. It is thought that he was the first of the disciples to be martyred. It is not clear whether he might have gone to Spain during his life but a tradition has developed that after his death his remains ended up in Compostella which has become a significant place of pilgrimage to this day. There is an established route and some people from our villages have made that journey. Another interesting possibility, but not proven, is that St Catherine's Well in Stradbrook, Bratton was a place of refreshment for pilgrims on that journey visiting many churches dedicated to St James on their way.

Much less is known of Bartholomew. Thought to be otherwise known as Nathanael he was one of the disciples called by Jesus early in his ministry. It is said that he took the Good News of Jesus to India where he was martyred either by beheading or being flayed alive and crucified.

What these 2 stories show is that the early disciples were so convinced of the divinity of Jesus – that he was God – that they were prepared to speak out and travel to distance places to speak of him and, if necessary to die for him. And they still do. We only have to read about the way in which Christians in Syria and Iraq are being persecuted under the ISIS regime to see that very ordinary people are prepared to stand up for their faith. Pray God that we might do the same.

2 Diary dates: on the 2nd July our exploration of Spirituality at Edington Parish Hall between 4 and 6pm will again focus on Prayer. Then on the 5th September our new Rector Andrew Sinclair will take over the reins of our 4 parishes. We look forward to his ministry amongst us and we wish him well.

We are hoping to apply for grants this summer to enable the purchase of a small slide unit for tots and an adult exercise course. Any donations to support this would be welcome. The steps of the large slide have become dangerous. We have applied for replacement steps but until they arrive can we ask parents to keep their children off the slide, the steps are cordoned off but children are still using them. Please help us prevent an accident.

Parking We live in a village with narrow lanes and with many houses not designed for cars which means parking will always be a difficulty ,but the Parish council respectfully asks car owners to be considerate while parking. Summer in the country means hay making and harvest so large farm vehicles will need access particularly round The Green Tinhead Road and Longhollow. An oil delivery vehicle and ambulance were unable to access Downs View recently due to poor parking blocking access. Just a reminder that Parking on pavements is illegal as is parking near junctions.

The last year has been challenging for the Council with some important issues requiring close detailed understanding and decision taking that affect the village well into the future. We are still one person short on the council, and if you are a resident of Erlestoke and would like to take part in what's happening in the village please let us know.

We formed a Neighbourhood Planning Committee chaired by Andrew Cooper to look into future development of Erlestoke. You will see from the agenda tonight we are keen to find out if there is an interest in the "Neighbourhood Plan". This must be driven from residents and not the just the council. We will look at the response from tonight's meeting and make a decision on its future.

The future of the George & Dragon is still ongoing, Erlestoke Parish Council applied to Wiltshire Council to consider the George & Dragon to be a "Community Asset" for the village, we were successful and to date that still applies. To manage the village's proposal the "Erlestoke Hub" was formed and chaired by Keith Lewcock. We were very pleased by the response from Erlestoke, Victoria Park, and interested people from the area. The upshot was that we raised enough finance to put an offer to the owners based on an expert valuation paid for by the Erlestoke Hub.

We are still working on the road crossing for school children on the B3098 adjacent to the George & Dragon. It seems lack of money from Highways will push this issue further down the priority list. We know the dangers but can't seem to move forward on this.

You may have noticed that speed checking is being carried out on the High Street we wait for the results. Councillor Dean Moore will manage the introduction of visual speed indicators that will flash your speed as you travel through the village. They will not be installed permanently but periodically throughout the year.

The Governments cut backs eventually have an impact on our services. We have lost the mobile library, the bus service to local hospitals and a possible reduction in bus service. All these will affect the life and wellbeing of the village but out of our control. We have reported the change of the road signs at the Lower Road cross road. The Erlestoke pointer sign is missing together with the junction warning sign being moved right on the junction thus reducing any warning distance at all. Strangely Highways do not inform us of these changes in our parish so we are following up after the event.

Our MP Claire Perry invited 2 members of Erlestoke Parish Council to visit Parliament on the 16th of November to have an open discussion about any local issues. Cllrs Jonik and our Clerk Anita Whittle attended. We raised the issue of the George & Dragon Community Asset and the very slow broadband speed received in the village. We also attended a separate meeting in Marlbourough with Claire Perry and a BT executive who was there to answer questions on broadband. The meeting was attended by locals from Claire Perrys (MP) constituency, but it soon became apparent that all the complaints came from village residents from the area. An observation was that there is a lack of interest in solving the broadband speed for villages and more interest in towns and cities where the cost benefits are obvious. Some villages are talking about paying for the installation themselves but at a

great expense. It has become apparent that the railway line through Erlestoke has fibre broadband running along the track.


We have had to deal with a number of environmental issues, first the announcement that Fracking is being looked at in the Erlestoke Parish, we have received a letter from Wiltshire Council that a licence to explore for gas and oil has been released for tender. Our Clerk Anita will publish this and answer questions at this meeting. Secondly it has been noted that there is a reduction in the spring water that feeds the Erlestoke lakes, we are not sure if this water is being extracted or it is a strange once in a life time occurrence in Erlestoke.

Thirdly the eight hundred trees that are to be felled in Erlestoke woods was initially planned for January this year, but we have received no reason for the delay.

Due to the recent changes of contract at Wiltshire Highways the reporting system for highways issues has changed. All problems must be reported either via the Wiltshire council website www.wiltshire.gov.uk or via the My Wiltshire app. This option has been added to the Erlestoke website www.erlestoke.org. The website menu option also allows reporting of any issue within the Parish and direct to Wiltshire Council.

The "Clean for the Queen" proved very successful thanks to Justin Hunt-Davis for organising the litter pick on the 5th and 6th of March. Through Adrian Hampton Wiltshire Council provided litter pickers and high viz jackets. 7 people turned out to take part.

This year we approved a small rise of £0.13 per week per band D household to help with our Precept. I would like to thank all the Councillors and parishioners for their efforts throughout the year and a special thanks to our Clerk Anita Whittle and our Devizes Area Board Councillor Richard Gamble for the support and hard work they do for the village.

Residential Trips



July will be a very busy month on the Plain starting with the continuation of the Field Training Unit Ex WESSEX STORM training the Scots Dragoon Guards in their light cavalry role using the Army Weapons Effect Simulation system. During the remainder of the month fourteen armoured, armoured infantry and mechanised infantry sub-units will conduct low and intermediate level armoured manoeuvre training in a series of two week exercises.

In addition the Plain will see the largest armoured exercise in the calendar Ex LIONS STRIKE involving the Combined Arms Tactics Course using the Imber Ranges and Copehill Down village from 25 - 28 July.

At the same time four of the Royal School of Artillery courses will combine for their largest training exercise of the year Ex CROSSED CANNONS during which AS90 armoured self propelled 155mm guns, multi launch rocket systems and 105mm light guns will live fire on the Larkhill Ranges.

The public should be aware that tank crossings over the A360, A345, A338, B390, and the C22 (Tilshead to Chitterne) roads will be very busy and if conditions are wet mud clearance parties will be working on the crossings. In dry weather conditions dust clouds may produce a hazard at these crossings.

Notice is given that the training areas in the Copehill Down and Bourne Valley (SPTA East) areas will be heavily used by tracked and wheeled armoured vehicles over this period and that recreational use of the Salisbury Plain military lands is to be restricted to public rights of way only as per the byelaws.

Use of Civilian Drones, UAVs and Model Aircrafts on SPTA

SPTA airspace is heavily used by military aircraft and UAVs and no unauthorised use of its airspace is to take place under any circumstances. Over the last three months we have encountered unauthorised flying by a paramotorist in the area between Shrewton and Tilshead, an individual flying a hang-glider over the impact area in the centre of Salisbury Plain and an individual flying his/her UAV in the area between Tilshead and Warminster; all three actions break the Salisbury Plain Military Byelaws 1981 and could have resulted in loss of life. Every effort is being made to ensure that these occurrences are not repeated in the future. Complaints/Enquiries should be made to 01980 620819.






