



Wiltshire Air Ambulance

funded by you, flying for you

Wiltshire Air Ambulance was established in March 1990 as a joint venture between the Wiltshire Ambulance Service NHS Trust and the Wiltshire Constabulary. Sharing resources kept their costs down and the charity needed £700,000 a year to keep Wiltshire's air ambulance in the skies. In January 2015 they started operating a dedicated air ambulance which means they must raise £3.25m a year.

They provide an essential Helicopter Emergency Medical Service (HEMS) throughout the county and beyond. The crew works alongside SWASfT (the South Western Ambulance Service foundation Trust) land crews and other emergency services to deliver the best medical care possible to anybody who lives, works or travels in Wiltshire.

The air ambulance can scramble in just two minutes and reach anywhere in Wiltshire within nine minutes. The speed of our helicopter, along with the skill of our crew, can make the difference between life and death.

They fly up to 19 hours a day and attend, on average, 3 potentially lifesaving missions in that time. They are called to all kinds of emergencies, from road traffic collisions to cardiac incidents, child-related emergencies to horse riding and cycling injuries. These incidents are not just in Wiltshire but in neighbouring counties as well (12% of our callouts are outside the county).





The FOUR VILLAGES LINK is a local befriending and support scheme staffed by a team of volunteers who offer assistance to those who need help within our community. Suppose you have to get to a medical appointment in Salisbury and have no means of getting there. What do you do? Very easy you simply pick up the phone, dial 07852 256 939 and talk to our duty co-ordinator who will log your request and endeavour to find a volunteer to help you. It is that simple. Our services range from organising transport to

and from medical appointments to carrying out small simple jobs around the house that do not require the services of a specialist tradesman. Although we are often viewed as a health related transport service we do carry out non health related tasks, including befriending, shopping, resolving basic computer issues and even dog walking!

So, if you would like help just call us on 07852 256 939 between 9am - 6pm Monday to Friday and one of our duty coordinators will log your request and find a volunteer to help you. All calls are charged at mobile rates. As responding to requests can be demanding it really helps to receive plenty of notice when being asked to organise assistance, ideally not less than 48 hours in advance.

TFVL is one of many support schemes in Wiltshire staffed by volunteers and anyone, of any age or ability can make use of it. Whilst LINK supports and complements local health and social services it is able to operate at a far more personal level and, for your peace of mind, all our volunteers are CRB checked and carry identity badges. However, the continued success of the scheme is reliant upon the support of our team of volunteers. With an increasingly older population, the substantial decline in funding services locally and every likelihood of public transport being curtailed even further, then it is inevitable that schemes like the LINK will be called upon to offer assistance more frequently. We cannot do this without the help of our dedicated volunteers and we are always looking for new people to join our team. Being a volunteer can give you a new interest as well as making good use of your skills and experience so, if you feel you can help or would just like to find out more about volunteering in any capacity, then please call for an initial chat on 07852 256 939.

HOPPER BUS WITHDRAWAL



The report looked back over a successful year with a wide variety of speakers, active interest groups, a lunch in August and a tea party during December. Carolyn was one of the group of people who worked hard to instigate the U3A group in Westbury five years ago, and with this in mind it was agreed to express thanks to her with some flowers. The treasurer reported that the group's finances were heathy and the committee for the coming year were elected.

She was able to source all materials needed from within Wiltshire, including other charities, and the families have now settled into their new lives. A group of members are looking forward to a visit to ss Great Britain on Monday. The next monthly meeting is on June 14 when there is a speaker from Monkey World. Newcomers are always welcome, we meet at the United Reformed Church Hall, starting at 2pm.

Keep it in perspective, they tell me. Don't sweat the small stuff!

Actually, I think the small stuff is often important. There are many issues that bother people but some are more tractable than others (I can't recall ever using the word "tractable" in my Message before, but the Cambridge English Dictionary says it means "easily dealt with").

So if you are worried or annoyed about something, let's hope it's tractable. On the whole, clearing footpaths, mending potholes, collecting litter – all should be manageable if common sense and goodwill can prevail. It must be said, however, that regulations and bureaucracy sometimes get in the way of common sense and one of the hardest parts of my job is finding a way around such barriers.

Issues arising from human character can be more intractable. Dog poo in a public place is probably a reflection on the ignorance or arrogance of the owner rather than the dog, and that may require sociologists to find a solution. If you have unpleasant neighbours, you may need the involvement of the courts to arbitrate.

At a higher level, defining problems and finding solutions are inevitably more complex. Climate change, education policy, immigration, the NHS, the EU – we all know there are problems but it is naive to think the solutions are simple. (I can't ever recall using the word "naive" but it means "showing a lack of experience wisdom or judgement "

What we see from the media on each of these topics often appears to be a war between zealots rather than an informed debate. Like you, probably, I have opinions about the issues but I don't pretend I am certain about the solutions. There are always questions to be asked. Are my ambitions for the outcome realistic or merely idealistic? Is short term pain worth long term gain? Can I rely upon the probity and efficiency of the institutions involved? More often than not, the answers are less than perfect.

If "certainty" implies "ignorance", I suspect the more zealous the commentator the more wrong they might be.

Your judgment is a good as mine on what is right but, on 23 June, we are no longer dealing with the small stuff.





So far we have been looking at specific events in the story of Jesus - his birth, his death on the cross and his resurrection, his Ascension into Heaven and his sending the Holy Spirit; but with June we spend time concentrating on aspects of his day to day life: the things that he did and the stories he told, mainly through the account set out in the book written by a man called Luke. Luke is someone whom we might nowadays describe as an 'investigative journalist' and possibly wrote his book some 30 to 50 years after Jesus' resurrection and Ascension - the earlier time is thought by some to be more likely. He probably did not know Jesus personally and his Gospel (for that is what his book is called) is based on his research. He tells a wonderful story and emphasises the love of God in Jesus. On the Sundays in June we will be looking at 2 miracles that Jesus carried out, a parable, and teaching on the personal cost that people would experience in following him. In the first miracle Jesus raises a man who has just died back to life. The only son of a widow he would have been her sole source of support - there was no welfare state in those days - and she faced destitution. It was a chance meeting with Jesus and demonstrated 2 things - the absolute unconditional compassion that he has for all people, and his divinity. Only God could restore the dead back to life. The second miracle relates to Jesus healing a man possessed by many demons, so many that he said his name was 'Legion'. Today we would see him as someone with a significant mental illness but demon possession has a fascination for us, many horror films depict it and exorcism is still a part of the pastoral ministry of the church. Here a man, naked, violent - chains could not restrain him - out of his mind, is restored, calm and properly clothed. It is another example of Jesus' compassion - a mind dead and deranged is made completely whole. Jesus says the man should return home and tell how much God has done for him. Almost explicitly Jesus is acknowledging that God and he are one. The parable is part of a story of a 'sinful' woman and a 'self righteous' man, gratitude for many sins forgiven and loving actions in response, and Jesus' status as one who forgives sins - for only God can do that. But what of personal cost? Luke tells of 3 potential disciples who said that they wanted to follow Jesus. But were they ready to make the sort of commitment that involved? It brings into focus the phrase "to take up one's cross and follow Jesus" which we will explore on the 26th. Just a final note. On the 12th at 1100 at St James we will be having a special service, music led by Bratton Silver Band, celebrating the Queen's 90th Birthday. You are all very welcome to join us.







We welcomed three visitors to our monthly meeting, all new ladies to the village, who we hope will join us on a regular basis. Meg, our President, told us of the various events that are on offer to members over the next few months – a trip to Bucklers Hard and a Stone Curlew Safari being just two. But the most important issue was our garden party in July. Both these Resolutions evoked debate amongst our members, some for, some against. At the end of the evening we voted in favour of the first resolution but rejected the second. A thought-provoking evening but one which our members enjoyed.





JUNE 2016 NEWSLETTER

June on the Plain will see a steady level of armoured and light role training throughout the month culminating in Exercise WESSEX STORM. Locally based Tidworth and Bulford armoured, armoured infantry, artillery and mechanised infantry units will conduct low level collective training across the whole of the Plain which will include live firing on the Larkhill artillery ranges. 3 Commando Brigade will deploy their Viking Armoured Support Group to Salisbury Plain in the first two weeks of the month to complete low level training. The second week of June will see the Armoured and Armoured Infantry courses from the Land Warfare Centre conducting their initial tactical training on exercise COMBAT TEAM followed by their final exercise TEAM SPIRIT in the third week of June. Both exercises will use the Imber and Larkhill ranges. The last week of June will see the Field Training Unit training the Scots Dragoon Guards in their light cavalry role using the Army Weapons Effect Simulation system on Exercise WESSEX STORM.

NOTICE - BYLAW ENFORCEMENT UPDATE

The Wilts Police conducted a routine enforcement patrol over the weekend 7th & 8th May 2016 with the following results; Saturday proved to be quite a successful day as a quad bike was seized from a male who had travelled from the west midlands with two other males, the male was reported for no licence, tax insurance, mot.

Various groups of off roaders, some legal but a large proportion appeared to be riding machines without plates and lights – these individuals were deterred from the training area. Sunday was much the same with lots of legal m/cyclist,4x4 drivers spoken to and a group from Southampton who had just arrived moved off the plain as they only had motto crossers; these were sent away.

USE OF CIVILIAN DRONES, UAVS AND MODEL AIRCRAFTS ON SPTA.

SPTA airspace is heavily used by military aircraft and UAVs and no unauthorised use of its airspace is to take place under any circumstances. Over the last three months we have encountered unauthorised flying by a paramotorist in the area between Shrewton and Tilshead, an individual flying a hang-glider over the impact area in the centre of Salisbury Plain and an individual flying his/her UAV in the area between Tilshead and Warminster; all three actions break the Salisbury Plain Military Byelaws 1981 and could have resulted in loss of life. Every effort is being made to ensure that these occurrences are not repeated in the future.

The building of new homes is an emotive subject. For those wanting to find a new home, their need is real whereas those not wanting any more extra homes are often accused as being NIMBYs – Not In My Back Yard!

In a previous newsletter, I reported how Wiltshire Council had adopted its Core Strategy. This document went through several iterations and in fact continues to do so. However, early on in the process, Wiltshire Council felt that 37,000 homes were needed to be built up until 2026. When a Planning Inspector saw this, as part of judging the soundness of the strategy, he upped this figure to 42,000 as a minimum!

In the Westbury area, our 'share' of this was 1615 homes, with 1500 being built in the town itself and the remainder in the villages. The Core Strategy also distinguishes between Large and Small villages and open countryside. Each have differing planning constraints, with the large villages likely to take the bulk of the extra 115 homes, small villages only having in-fill (one or two homes) and the open countryside - no further development being permitted. In my division, the large villages are Bratton and Dilton Marsh, with Edington being a small village and Coulston and Heywood and Hawkeridge being open countryside.

Locally, there have been attempts to use land in Edington and this was withdrawn. However, this community recognises the need for the village to grow. Indeed, in my own village of Keevil, I often speak to people who do not want any further development. In reality they want to preserve their village in 'aspic' which is ironic since they often live in homes that have been part of waves of newer development. Meanwhile, Edington as a community has embarked on a journey to consider creating a Neighbourhood Plan. This allows the residents to determine where any extra developments occurs, identifies where potential employment sites might be and looks holistically at the needs of the community for the future. This process will need to eventually involve the whole community, especially since a poll of all residents will be conducted towards its conclusion. I very much welcome this and it demonstrates a positive and forward looking approach and look forward to working with the community. This stance means that this village will be able to direct where homes are built and can then never be accused of being NIMBYs.


