



Lent is an unusual time within the Christian year. Everyone knows about Christmas and Easter, and many people on the fringes of church life make their visits to church at these times: and they are very warmly-welcomed to their local churches and to all the fun activities going on. Indeed, as I travel from church to church at these major festivals, I am amazed at the number of people that go to church. The Church of England is a real and vibrant presence in each of our local communities, and very much at the centre of village life: it's the sort of coverage and percentage market share that large supermarkets would die for!

However, it's not always like that, and congregations can be much smaller at other times (although I am in the privileged position of travelling between many services in a day, and so see that lots of smaller congregations do still add up significantly across the local area). In all honesty, people don't relate to Lent in the same way as they do to Easter and Christmas, which are entirely joyful. Lent is more complex: it is subtle, it is an acquired taste – and there are some overtones from history that still need dealing with in the modern age.

Historically, Lent has been a time in the church year where people who like doom and gloom could really roll around in it. Jesus warned us against this type of attitude and about making sacrifices for the show of it all. There is also a danger that psychologically-susceptible people may be unnecessarily harsh in their judgements of themselves: perhaps the question to ask, in restoring balance, is what would the all-forgiving Jesus ask of you, as opposed to what you demand of yourself? Actually then, in modern good practise, Lent is a time of self-examination and deep reflection-but it always needs to be kept in balance, and within a loving context, that encourages personal growth, and does not dwell unnecessarily on the negative.

Sacrifices and 'giving things up for Lent' are still undertaken by many churchgoers, and I don't want to stop this: but these days, people are far tighter about why they are doing it. Sacrifice without purpose benefits nobody. The idea of 'giving things up for Lent' is to do with acknowledging a distraction or a source of focus in your life which competes with a focus on God, or a focus on something which you have identified as being unhelpful in a balanced life. Actually identifying the area which you're not happy about does take some time and prayerful reflection, and is half the battle: automatically going for a ban on chocolate biscuits might not always be the best option, if you have really dug deep!

So Lent is a complex thing: difficult to do well, and demanding – but well worth it! God bless you all.

THE FOUR VILLAGES LINK is a registered charity scheme, is your local community support group that can provide you with assistance through our dedicated group of about 40 volunteers. With the decline in locally funded services we can help fill the gap by providing transport to and from hospitals, doctors, dentists and other appointments as well as help with a variety of practical tasks. We are also able to offer aid with small practical household tasks and we even have a wheelchair that can be loaned out on a short term basis.

So, if you would like help just call us on **07852 256939 between 9am-6pm Monday to Friday** and one of our duty coordinators will log your request and find a volunteer to help you. All calls are charged at mobile rates. Responding to requests can be demanding so it really helps to receive plenty of notice when being asked to organise assistance, ideally not less than 48 hours in advance.

Visiting the RUH in Bath – You may have seen in the local press that there is a strong possibility that the Wiltshire Hopper Bus service will be withdrawn later in the year. However, it is still operating at the moment so, if you need to visit the RUH in Bath then please use this bus if at all possible. This is a bookable service, operating Monday to Friday at affordable rates, (if you are a bus pass holder then the return journey is only £8). The return service leaves the RUH on an hourly basis at half past the hour. Wheelchair access is available on the Hopper. To make your booking call 08456 525 255 (then select Option 2) by 10:00 the day before you wish to travel. Further details can be found at: www.wiltshire.gov.uk/connect2wilts-ruh-hopper.pdf.

TFVL is one of 45 support schemes in Wiltshire staffed by volunteers and anyone, of any age or ability can make use of the scheme for almost anything, and in this way we can help to improve the quality of life for residents in our community. Whilst the LINK supports and complements local health and social services it is able to operate at a far more personal level and, for your peace of mind, all our volunteers are CRB checked and carry identity badges.

However, the success of the LINK scheme is purely down to the continuing support of our volunteers and, with an increasing population of older people, together with the forecast decline in funding services locally, it is inevitable that we will be called upon more frequently to offer assistance. As a result, we are always looking for new volunteers to help with our many requests, connecting our clients with appropriate volunteers or serving on our Management Committee. 





## A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division



It may still be winter for a few weeks yet, but spring is on its way. The days are getting longer, the snowdrops are out and when the sun shines, it is just about possible to feel a little warmth.

The economy is rather like that. Slowly, the gloom of the worst recession since the war is beginning to lift. On the most recent data, for example, only 2.0% of 18 to 24 year olds in Wiltshire were on Job Seekers Allowance, and the proportion

is steadily falling. Just 1.1% of 16 year olds were not in education, employment or training. That amounts to a mere 53 individuals, all of whom have access to support to help them find their feet and to plan for the future.

From another angle, there is a burst of new business formation. At the last count, 2,825 businesses in Wiltshire were under 2 years old. Starting a new business can be tough so if you know someone locally who has set up a new enterprise, I urge you to give them your support and your custom. The whole local economy will benefit from their success.

Of course, a growing economy poses some challenges. The construction industry has been one of the first sectors to feel the upturn and, to most of us, that must be a good thing. However, having regard to the "education" part of my portfolio responsibilities (the others are "skills" and "youth"), the result has been that bids for school building contracts are coming in rather higher than I would wish. I am delighted, therefore, that government has agreed to increase the amount of capital available to Wiltshire for "basic need" (i.e. new school places) to nearly £16 million in 2017/18 (up from £5.4m in 15/16 and £5.7m in 16/17).

Not everything in the economic garden is rosy, of course, and there may be storms still to come. But there are unmistakable signs that we are past the worst.

#### EDINGTON HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY

Last year your Parish Council conducted a Housing Needs Survey in order to inform the development of a new village plan for the years ahead.

The response rate of 47% was really good for a survey of this nature and has given your Parish Council sufficient information to develop plans for the future. The survey includes parts of Bratton, including Bonnie Park, which lie within the Edington Parish boundaries. The main outcomes of the survey are:

- 1) The village comprises 92% of owner occupiers, with 4% socially rented and 2% rented from a landlord (figures are approximations);
- 2) 75% of the population have lived in the village in excess of 10 years. The age group is largely in the 45 + age group;
- 3) 75% of the respondents are in favour of new homes in the village, with 58% supporting new starter homes for the young and a significant number in favour of social rented accommodation. There is no perceived demand for large, expensive developments.






#### News from your Wiltshire Councillor Jerry Wickham

At the time of writing this article, as Councillors in Wiltshire, we are engaged in the discussions on producing a balanced budget for 2015/16. The grant we receive from central government has reduced by £15m and with other needs, such as the first pay rise for our staff for a number of years and other areas of demand going up, has meant that we have to find a total of £30m in savings. This is being achieved but we are insisting that we will continue to protect the elderly, young and vulnerable in our communities. We are also determined to once again freeze the Council Tax, since by raising it affects everyone. This will be the sixth year in succession of a freeze and during this time the average householder has saved £780.

Difficult decisions have to be made and we are therefore going to charge for the collection of green waste and I fully appreciate that very many residents responded recently to a survey on this very subject. The result of this was that most people chose for a 3 month suspension in recognition of the need to save money. However, due to the lower level of grant to the Council, charging for green waste will result in higher levels of savings. We are genuinely sorry about this but it is also felt that this is fairer option, since it allows people to chose to pay a yearly charge of £40, (£1.60 per collection) whereas raising the Council Tax affects everyone, whether they have a garden or not.

Locally, the Westbury Area Board has recently met and in recognition of the area's homes putting out high levels of household waste, before any recycling, has launched an initiative involving schools, to raise awareness with a view of reducing what we throw out. It has been some while since we last had a publicity drive on this but I hope that we can build further upon this over the next year at village events.






We were also treated to some excellent tips about 'good housekeeping for healthy plants'... digging and manuring, recognising pests and diseases and crop rotation.


We learnt how to know our soil, how to best use the warmer spots in our gardens and how to plan for a succession of plants rather than one huge glut!


