



THE BURNBAKE TRUST

The Burnbake Trust is a registered charity, founded in the late sixties, based in Wilton. The Charity's main function is to provide donated essential household goods, sometimes in emergency situations, to disadvantaged local people.



These people are referred to us by Social Services, Age Concern, Women's Refuge, SSAFA and other agencies.

They have three shops, and a warehouse in Wilton, and operate a busy furniture collection and redistribution service locally. They sell a variety of donated household goods from bric-a-brac, china, books, clothing, furniture and electrical items. In addition to donated goods they sell gifts, cards, plants and haberdashery. If you are thinking of clearing out that wardrobe, or getting rid of the contents of your attic, then just bring your good quality clothes, shoes, jewellery, books, home furnishings and electrical items along to their main shop at 29 North Street, Wilton, just 50 yards from the Market Square. Look out for the blue (squeaky) door!

The Burnbake Trust is totally self funding, and the majority of their funding is raised from the sale of donated goods at their shops and warehouse, or at various events and stalls. Therefore any funding, donations or offers of help are always gratefully received.





If you would like help just call us on 07852 256 939 between 9am – 6pm Monday to Friday and one of our duty coordinators will log your request and find a volunteer to help you. All calls are charged at mobile rates. Responding to requests can be demanding so it really helps to receive plenty of notice when being asked to organise

assistance, ideally not less than 48 hours in advance.

There has been much speculation and comment in the press recently about Wiltshire Council's decision to withdraw the Hopper Bus service to the RUH in Bath in May. However, as the service is currently still operating please use this bus if at all possible. It is a bookable service, operating Monday — Friday at affordable rates (concessionary fares are available) and there is wheelchair access available. TFVL is one of many support schemes in Wiltshire staffed by volunteers and anyone, of any age or ability can make use of it. Whilst LINK supports and complements local health and social services it is able to operate at a far more personal level and, for your peace of mind, all our volunteers are CRB checked and carry identity badges.

However, the continued success of the scheme is going to be even more reliant upon the support of our team of volunteers. With an increasingly older population, a substantial decline in funding services locally and every likelihood of public transport being curtailed even further across the county, then it is inevitable that schemes like the LINK will be called upon more frequently to offer assistance. We cannot do this with-

out the help of our dedicated volunteers and we are therefore looking for new people to join our team to help fulfil the requests.

It seems to me that crime is quite common at the moment. I've recently caught episodes of Midsomer Murders, Silent Witness, Death in Paradise, Shetland and Vera (and there may be other dramas that I have missed). In each case, the crimes are horrid but the police are wonderful, eventually. Fortunately, the real-life crime rate around here is not nearly so bad. But that does not mean some does not exist and we each must play our part in preventing it.

Recently, one of our shops was victim to the crime of "making off without payment", which to you and me is theft. The problem was, no one reported the crime for three days. The police have much less chance of catching the culprit when the trail is so cold. From a location such as this, if the getaway car can be identified, the culprits could potentially be apprehended before they even reach Salisbury or Trowbridge or wherever if such a crime is reported promptly. Occasionally, there may be other criminal activities around here. You may spot miscreants hare coursing on the edge of the Plain or joy riding up there in stolen cars. In our communities, bogus door to door salesmen may employ techniques involving pressure selling, unfair contracts, overpriced or substandard home maintenance or improvements, phoney consumer surveys or bogus charity collections. Fraudulent salespeople, if let in, can take note of your valuables and any security measures you have in place.

The rule is, if you think a crime is being committed and is in progress, phone 999. Phone 101 if a crime has already been committed and there is no sign of the offender. We have a great local team to help us. Our local officers are: PC Jo Newbery – Community Beat Manager, PCSO Fiona Marno, PCSO Ellen Carter

To keep in touch, I urge you to sign up for www.wiltsmessaging.co.uk. And on the roads, look out for the 'Community Volunteer' marked police vehicle donated by Volvo for use in supporting public safety issues such as Community Speed Watch. It has its own calibrated speed monitoring device which can be used for enforcement action including fixed penalty notices by the police.

March, in our Christian calendar this year, is a month of ups and downs, or perhaps more accurately of downs and ups.

We start the month with a celebration, Mothering Sunday. 



The speaker at our January meeting was Steve Hodson the Governor of Erlestoke prison who gave us an insight into the work of the prison and the lives of the inmates. Steve has been the Governor of this category C prison, housing 524 men since 2014 and is clearly passionate about his role and that of the prison service. Erlestoke is a national centre with an offender behaviour system that addresses the needs of prisoners to lessen their risks of reoffending. There are courses tackling issues such as: domestic violence, relationships, alcohol abuse and a 12 step drug recovery programme. This last one is particularly significant as up to half the inmates have a drug addiction problem. There are also courses in maths and literacy; many of the prisoners have low levels of these basic skills that are so vital to living and working outside of prison. We were entertained by Alan Power, Head Gardener from Stourhead, at our February meeting.


We last heard from Alan in 2007, so he was able to tell us about everything he had been up to since then. He first joined the staff at Stourhead 20 years ago as number 6. There are still only 6 full time gardening staff with 15 volunteers. The House and Estate have a total of 480 volunteers. The Hoare banking family built the Palladian House and the gardens which were a reaction against the formal gardens of the 17th Century. After seven generations the estate was passed to the National Trust in 1947. Alan's enthusiasm for not only the garden but the history of the family and previous headgardeners shines through. Louise, Alan's wife, also came along and she is now the gardener for Stourton House. The weather at the estate has been quite challenging this winter but only torrential rain stops any work. The first snowdrops were seen on 22nd December with such a mild winter. Alan showed us slides of the restoration work carried out on the Pantheon (built in 1753) and it was good to hear that some of the timbers used are from the estate. Alan also told us about his Radio 4 chats, over the past eight years, and his four programmes on BBC4,' British Gardens in Time'. Visitors have been going to Stourhead for the last 250 years and we

look forward to taking another look ourselves for our August meeting.

THE UNIVERSITY OF THE THIRD AGE

In February Westbury and District U3A were entertained by Fran Sandham who gave an interesting and amusing account of his solo walk across Africa, called the Traversa. This trek of nearly 3600 miles was from the Skeleton Coast in the west to Zanzibar in the East and crossed through Namibia, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Malawi and Tanzania.

He first became excited about Africa from reading Tarzan comics at the age of 6 but developed an interest in the Victorian explorers/travellers such as Livingstone and Stanley later in life. The decision to undertake the journey came from a New Year's resolution. He spent the next year scrimping together the £3000 needed for the trip which he expected to take 12 months. There was nothing scientific in deciding the route – the Skeleton coast sounded exotic and Zanzibar, where many of the Victorian explorers started their journeys, sounded exciting.

He undertook no specific fitness training but under the harsh Namibian sun, Fran soon realised he was carrying far too much weight. His pack weighed 100 pounds and he soon had to start dumping items and giving things away en route. One of the first things to go was his mini-stove as he realised he could get by without cooking food. By the time he had crossed half of the Namib Desert, he was carrying about 60 pounds. Complete with his two trekking poles, which made him look as if he was skiing across the desert, he made good progress across the stark landscape travelling up to 35 miles a day - until calamity struck in the form of a stubborn donkey. He decided to buy a pack animal to make the journey easier. The donkey called Tsondab, which literally means Where You Get Stuck, was not very enthusiastic about the journey. They went round and round in circles for weeks and weeks. Eventually Fran admitted defeat, gave the donkey to a nice farm, and travelled further in the next 20 minutes than he had done in the previous two and a half months.

Fran's journey had its inevitable ups and downs. He suffered diarrhoea for most of the trip after contracting giardiasis from contaminated water, he had an encounter with a puff adder, was wakened at night by lions growling nearby and contracted malaria at the end of his journey. He, however, fondly remembers the warm hospitality of the local people along his route, being followed from place to place by crowds of noisy children, beautiful Lake Malawi and the spectacular Victoria Falls. Despite losing almost a third of his body weight, Fran was reluctant to finish his arduous journey. He concluded by saying he loved travelling and has considered new expeditions since, but has never quite attempted another one! 



News from your Wiltshire Councillor – Jerry Wickham

During the recent round of discussions and consultation over Wiltshire Council's budget plans, some quite startling facts emerged. The entire budget for the county is over £900m of which £587m is

ring-fenced for schools, benefits and housing revenue account

Of the remainder, f.150m is spent on highways, waste collection, subsidised buses, leisure & libraries and f179m on vulnerable residents to include: the elderly, children & adults with learning difficulties, severely disabled children & adults, mental health, and prevention of child sexual exploitation

One statistic that really caught my eye was the fact that currently 23.4% of our population is at retirement age and in 10 years, this will rise to 27.1%. Wiltshire is known to have a higher than average older population, partly due to the lovely area we live in. However, there is recognition that the funding going into looking after our ageing population and other vulnerable residents will continue to increase as time goes on. When this is balanced against the need to repair our roads and collect our waste etc and the fact that the funding from central Government continues to decrease, means that preparing and then delivering on our available finances remains a complex business.

Topical issues in the area at present, include the consultation on public transport, especially where the Council subsidises buses, which is open until 4 April. This can be completed on line at http://consult.wiltshire.gov.uk/portal/ltp/wiltshire_local_transport_plan_-_public_transport_strategy_review and I would encourage residents to complete this. Additionally, hard copies are available at Wiltshire Libraries.
