



SERVING OTHERS

In the film "The Queen", starring Michael Sheen and Helen Mirren, we have a fictionalised glimpse of the meeting between the Sovereign and the winner of a general election, where the Queen asks the Prime Minister to form a Government in her name. It's formally known as "an invitation to kiss hands", with the actual invitation and reception of the Minister being the invitation to form a government. Kissing hands, as a sign of fealty and loyalty, does not take place at this time in modern practice. Famously, in the film, Sheen is aware of the name of the meeting, but is unfamiliar with what is actually involved, as he has never held ministerial office before. The winner of the General election asserts himself and calls upon the Queen to invite him to form a government. He is gently, but firmly, reminded that it is the Sovereign, in this country, who takes the initiative in asking someone who can command the respect of the House to form a government. Sheen is then reminded of all of the Prime Ministers who have gone before him, whose duty it has been to serve the Sovereign and the nation in the office of Prime Minister. The episode is amusing and memorable, but is entirely fictitious, and has a purpose in helping us to understand the personalities and roles of the main characters for the rest of the film.

I expect that many people, by the time when the General Election results are actually known, will be heartily sick of all the coverage. Writing this piece in early April, experts also predict some additional serious haggling before a government is eventually formed that will command a working majority in the House of Commons. But when all is said and done, it is not the tears in the eyes of well-known politicians, the disappointment and the many surprises that an election is all about. It is not about the particular occupant of a bullet-proof car and the drama of a drive with motorcycle outriders to Buckingham Palace to kiss hands. The trappings of power ought to be incidental to the fact that, whatever government is elected, it is there to serve all of the people. In this country, our monarchs are made to take solemn Coronation vows before God to defend the weak against the strong, to minister justice impartially

and to serve the whole nation before they can be crowned. The vows made by our senior politicians when they are sworn of the Privy Council are not witnessed by the public, but are a solemn undertaking nonetheless, and carry responsibilities as well as privileges.

I ask that you will join me in praying for all who offer themselves as candidates; for all whose role it is to carry out the policies of whatever government is formed; for those who call that government to account, and for all those are elected to serve others.

May God bless us all

AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL BEGAN WITH ONE MAN'S OUTRAGE AND HIS COURAGE TO DO SOMETHING ABOUT IT.

After learning of two Portuguese students imprisoned for raising a toast to freedom in 1961, British lawyer Peter Benenson published an article, "The Forgotten Prisoners" in the Observer newspaper. That article launched the "Appeal for Amnesty 1961", a worldwide campaign that provoked a remarkable response. Reprinted in newspapers across the world, his call to action resonated with the values and aspirations of people everywhere. This was the genesis of Amnesty International.

- ★ In 1971 Amnesty International's 10th anniversary receives widespread publicity in international press, radio and television, in a year when 700 prisoners are released.
- ★ In 1986 Amnesty International marked its 25th anniversary with Voices for Freedom, an anthology reflecting the lives of people who fought for human rights and for whom the organization has worked.
- ★ Amnesty International USA launches the Conspiracy of Hope concert tour with U2, FelaKuti, Sting, Peter Gabriel, Lou Reed, the Neville Brothers and others.
- ★ In 1991 Amnesty International's 30th anniversary broadens its scope to cover work on abuses by armed groups, hostage-taking and people imprisoned for their sexual orientation.
- After political change in eastern and central Europe, more than 40 Amnesty International groups are set up in every country of the region
- ★ In 2007 Amnesty International launches a global petition calling on Sudan's government to protect civilians in Darfur, and produces a CD, Make Some Noise: the Campaign to Save Darfur, featuring 30 internationally known musicians to mobilize support.
- ★ Following intense campaigning by Amnesty International and its partners in the World Coalition against the Death Penalty, the UN adopts the first-ever resolution calling for a global moratorium on the use of the death penalty.
- ★ Nelson Mandela accepts the Ambassador of Conscience Award and congratulates Amnesty International for making the struggle against poverty its focus for the coming years.
- ★ Amnesty International organizes worldwide protests against five years of unlawful detentions in Guantánamo Bay.
- ★ In a landmark victory for Indigenous rights and corporate accountability, the Indian government rejects plans by multinational corporation Vedanta to mine bauxite in the Niyamgiri Hills, eastern India. The decision follows years of campaigning by the DongriaKondh and other Indigenous communities who described the proposed mining project as a threat to their very existence. Amnesty International's damning report, don't mine us out of existence, forms the basis for this decision.
- ★ Aung San Suu Kyi, Myanmar's best-known prisoner of conscience, is released from house arrest in November.

A MESSAGE FROM RICHARD GAMBLE WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR FOR THE LAVINGTONS & ERLESTOKE DIVISION

How is your memory? If, like me, you are getting on a bit, you may find that it's easier to remember some events from your early life than it is to remember things from just days ago. Those old memories may give you the idea that life was once nicer than it is now. Somebody recently told me that they thought the world was better 40 years ago. Less traffic, better television, polite children, respectable politicians. At least in those days I was at ease with the cutting edge of technology. I was among the first to buy a Sinclair computer and I soon mastered the electronic game of tennis that it offered. I even had a phonecard that worked in cashless telephone boxes.

Unfortunately, I have since succumbed to another feature of the aging process, that it is now harder to keep up with technology and social trends. I'm old enough to think that mobile phones are phones, but mobile. In fact, they are super computers that can access almost anything on the internet, can send or receive emails or texts, can take photos or movies, can direct you like sat-navs and can have applications (apps) that perform miracles. With the **My Wiltshire app**, for example, you can report things like potholes, dog mess, graffiti, litter and street lighting on the go using your smartphone. I have recently had the opportunity to visit many of our schools and, without exception, I have been impressed with the teachers and the children that I have met. Over 85% of children in Wiltshire are now in schools rated by Ofsted as Good or Outstanding, which is well above the national average. All of the schools in this area come into one of those categories and the head teachers, the staff and the pupils all deserve credit for that achievement despite the fact that our funding from government per child is about the lowest in the country.

Of course, the world is not perfect and who can tell what lies ahead. But I hope one phrase used by my grandfather still holds true. When asked how things were going, he'd invariably reply "Onwards and upwards".

SYLVANUS ARTHUR 'VENN' HARRIS D.F.C. 1922-2015

Venn' as he was known to everyone, founded this magazine, "The News', during 1980 and 1981 together with Ted Bunting, both residents of Edington; others were also involved. Prior to that time there were two publications, one produced by the church and the other more community based. Venn and Ted decided that it was both wasteful economically and in terms of effort to continue with two and they were merged. Ted Bunting became the first editor and Venn the Treasurer. Under their guidance "The News' flourished, with advertising encouraged to help defray costs aided by donations and helpers to distribute it. Since those beginnings there have been two further editors and several treasurers and the magazine has gone from strength to strength.

Venn was born in Walston, Devon in 1922, into a family that became four. He was educated at Wellingborough Public School. He then studied at Agriculture College, eventually joining the RAF in the early days of World War II, when he trained in South Africa as a pilot. He saw service in India, Japan and elsewhere in the Far East as well as Europe; he was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for bravery. He left the RAF with the rank of Squadron Leader and after the war became a banker. Such was his modesty that very few, if any, knew of his wartime exploits. While stationed in Hong Kong in 1966 he met Mary, a WREN officer and their subsequent marriage lasted almost fifty years, until Venn's death at 93 this year.

Moving to Edington in the 1970's Venn and Mary took and active part in village life. A very keen gardener he was famed locally for his grapes, as well as being renowned for his bee keeping and supplying many with his superb honey. For a number of years Venn could be seen manning the gate to the annual Edington Fair and collecting the entrance fee. He also had a keen interest in beagling and continued with it well into his late 80's despite failing eyesight. As the upkeep of a large garden became too much Venn and Mary moved to Devizes, where they lived until Venn's death this April.

He was a lovely man, a true gentleman in every aspect of that word. He always had a kind word and never spoke ill of anyone and was always willing to offer advice when called upon. Despite his many activities he remained a very private and modest man. There are some people one comes across in life that you admire and never forget, Venn was such a person. B. M-S


U3A REPORT 25 YEARS SITTING ON THE BENCH (LIFE OF A JP)

At the meeting on Tuesday 14th April Mrs Priscilla Gray spoke about her life as a JP and how it changed over the years since she became one in 1986. At that time Magistrates were recommended, proposed, and then interviewed. Nowadays you may ring up and apply. Also female magistrates although they no longer had to wear hats in 1986 they were not allowed to wear trouser suits. Men could not wear school/college/regimental ties. Magistrates are not allowed to draw attention to themselves by the way they dress, they must appear neutral. They are not paid but can claim travelling and lunch expenses but if they are self employed and need to employ somebody else to cover their absence these costs may also be claimed. Those who work often find it difficult to have time off to attend court and then occasionally resign in order to keep their jobs. Following initial training there are at least two days further training a year.

Mrs Gray began her life as a magistrates on the Westbury bench, which then met in Warminster because they had cells. The court later moved to Trowbridge. Smaller courts were useful in that the magistrates knew the locality which offences took place, particularly relevant in the case of motoring offences. She stressed that magistrates must see each case on its merits. Usually three magistrates sit with the middle one acting as chair and who speaks on behalf of them all. Sitting in front of them is a legal adviser who arranges the business of the court.

In 1990 it was decided the smaller benches would be amalgamated and Trowbridge, Bradford-on-Avon, Melksham Warminster and Whorlesdown (who met at Steeple Ashton) became West Wilts Magistrates Court. After ten years it was decided there would be another amalgamation and North & West Wilts Magistrates came into being and they sit at Chippenham. Magistrates also sit on Saturdays and Bank Holiday Mondays and also deal with Youth and Family courts when very difficult decisions have to be made. Until quite recently they also dealt with licencing matters such as protection orders for new publicans, occasional licences and gun licences. Magistrates, if they are on duty, may be woken in the middle of the night in order to sign search warrants. Mrs Gray illustrated her talk with several amusing anecdotes and said she felt it had been a privilege to serve as a magistrate, that it had always been a challenge and she had enjoyed the camaraderie with her colleagues. There was a question and answer session at the end of a very informative and enjoyable talk which was followed by refreshments. 
