

BUILDING A NEW FUTURE

I'm writing this article two days before the Independence Referendum in Scotland, which means I do not know the outcome, at the time of writing. The Referendum was not high on the list of many peoples' topics of conversation around here, even up until a few weeks ago - but now it is talked about widely, and people are praying about it openly in churches too. It's often said that the British don't talk about politics or religion in public: now they do.

Whatever the result, and putting aside the political aspects, I ask myself the question, "What is it that glues a country together?".

In a way, this question can be asked on a smaller scale too. What glues this community together? Indeed, what is the bond that holds couples together?

A shared bond, a belief that we are all on the same side, being part of the same team, sharing in common experience: these things come rapidly to mind. A history together; memories of shared times and cherished moments are important too. It's obviously important to enjoy spending time together, enjoying one another's company. Quite often, facing challenges or adversity together, in common cause, is also very important: on a local scale, this may not be anything like facing the same enemy in countless wars, but a battle against the wind and rain at a local fete, or mucking in together to make a barbecue happen, or joining in with fundraising for some local project or repair work. At the end of the day, of course, there has to be a will to move on, together, because no one can live on memories alone: part of life is re-invention and the re-energising of relationships.

I often get newly-engaged, but previously-divorced couples asking me whether they can get married in church. I am required to ask them some searching questions as part of the process before they can get married again in church. One question that I ask them to think about is, "What they have you learned about yourself, and about your previous relationship?". "How can this help you to build a better relationship in the future?".

Maybe these are questions for all of us nationally, locally and in our personal relationships too: what do our relationships tell us about ourselves, and why are we in these particular relationships? How, indeed is it possible to make them better – and can we spot the areas of difficulty, before there are problems?



The Four Villages Link duty coordinators will log your request and find a volunteer to help you. All calls are charged at mobile rates. Responding to requests can be demanding so it helps to receive plenty of notice when being asked to organise assistance, ideally not less than 48 hours in advance.

The Four Villages Link, a registered charity, is staffed entirely by local volunteers. We offer help in a practical way to those around us who require some assistance and anyone, of any age or ability, can make use of the scheme. Our services range from organising transport to and from medical appointments to carrying out small simple jobs around the house that do not require the services of a specialist tradesman.

Perhaps you might consider helping our scheme by becoming a volunteer - you can offer as much or as little time as you like, at a time to suit you. It is a great way to meet new people and become more involved in the community, as well as providing an important service to those in our four villages who might need a helping hand from time to time. 


Preseason U14's have played matches at Warminster, Corsham and Trowbridge Town

MILITARY TRAINING IN OCTOBER

October starts with the Land Warfare Centre Armoured Troop Commanders Course Exercise FIRST VIEW training with Challenger 2 Tanks across the West and into the Centre on the 1st & 2nd October. At the same time 26 Engineer Regiment will start a 2 week Armoured Engineer battle run, and Armoured Infantry Companies from 1st Battalion The Royal Welsh and 1st Battalion The Yorkshire Regiment will conduct armoured manoeuvre training in Warriors.

11th – 17th October 1st Battalion The Royal Welsh and 101 Logistics Brigade will rehearse for and conduct the Land Command Power Demonstration exercise for the Joint Staff College Shrivenham. This will involve an Armoured Battle Group manoeuvring in the West and logistic stands around Old Carter Barracks near Bulford. At the same time the Armoured Infantry Course from Warminster will conduct Exercise RARDENS REVENGE in Warrior Armoured Vehicles across the Plain.







Throughout the latter half of the month an Armoured Cavalry Squadron from the Royal Dragoon Guards will be practicing their reconnaissance drills across the whole Plain in CVRT vehicles. 101 Logistics Brigade are due to conduct Exercise GRIFFIN VIPER for 3 weeks from 6th – 25th October which will involve three logistic regiments with some 180 heavy wheeled transport and load carrying vehicles running convoys across the whole Plain and making extensive use of the track system and tank crossings over main roads. A very busy final week in which the 2nd largest Armoured Exercise TEAM SPIRIT from the Land Warfare Centre incorporating the Brigade Reconnaissance course final exercise; BADGERS STRESS will take place. They will be joined by a Squadron of CVRT from the Royal Tank Regiment, an Armoured Engineer Squadron from 22 Engineer Regiment, a Multi Launch Rocket System Battery from 39 Regiment Royal Artillery and a Company of Omani troops preparing for Exercise WESSEX STORM in November.

Heavy use of Armoured vehicles during the month day and night will mean that the public are advised to restrict their recreational activities to the public rights of way and privileged tracks. If moving off them on foot then additional care should be taken to avoid disrupting military training and placing themselves at risk. Motorists are advised that the tank crossings on all major public roads transiting the Plain will be in regular use and that mud sweepers will be operating on the roads if the weather turns foul. 
THE MAKING OF "CASABLANCA"

We were given an informative and entertaining talk by Edward Barham on the making of the film "Casablanca". Firstly he explained to us that the film industry settled in Hollywood because of the good weather and light. Silent films used many experienced central European actors but these were often replaced by English speaking actors when talking pictures arrived as non accented "correct" speech was needed. The nationality of many actors/directors and technicians again became European as they fled Nazi Germany in the period leading up to and during the second world war.

We were then told that "Casablanca" began life as a stage play but it was never performed. The play was sold to Warner Bros for \$20,000. The film script however was barely recognisable from the original play. The budget was just under \$1,000,000 but was exceeded by some \$75,000. The film was premiered in New York on 26th November 1942 and grossed \$3,600,000 in its first year.

Mr Barham outlined the histories of the cast, many of whom had themselves escaped Nazi Germany and its allies and some of whom lost families in the concentration camps. Humphrey Bogart however was American, born to a well to do family and could have become a chess grand master but he went into films often playing villains opposite George Raft. Warner Bros noticed him in "High Sierra" and offered him the part in "Casablanca". Ingrid Bergman was Swedish. Following the deaths of her parents she was brought up by an uncle and later used her inheritance to pay for acting lessons. She made films in both Sweden and Germany. Paul Henreid the third star was born in Trieste into a Viennese banking family. He went into films and fled Austria in 1934 coming to Britain where he became a naturalised citizen. He played the part of the German master in Goodbye Mr Chips. He then went to Hollywood and only agreed to take part in the film if he had equal billing. Many other actors in the film such as Carol Veidt (German), Sidney Greenstreet (British) and Peter Laurie (Hungarian) were also all born in the first fifteen or so years of the 20th century. They all had interesting histories and eventful lives before entering the film industry. The film's story was all to real to many of them. They also were refugees. There were several factual errors in the film but that has never prevented Hollywood from letting facts get in the way of telling a good story. Many of the film crew became emotional during the part of the film that contained "the battle of the songs" where the German soldiers sang an old German folk song and the others the Marseilles, it was all too real to them. The film became memorable for six lines such as "here's looking at you kid". It was a triumph of duty over desire. The film was nominated for eight Oscars and won three, Best Adapted Screenplay, Best Director and Best Picture. It became a cult film when shown at Harvard during finals week, this became a tradition and is also shown at other universities. It is the most shown film on television in America.

GREAT START TO THE SCHOOL YEAR!

NEW CHILDREN

We are always delighted to welcome our new children into our school — most of them into the Foundation Stage but others in various year groups through the school. We are a warm and welcoming community and new children settle quickly. We have been particularly pleased with the youngest children who have adjusted to school life and routines remarkably quickly! Our strong and supportive families help to ensure that transition is effective and learning is outstanding.

UNIVERSAL INFANT FREE SCHOOL MEALS

In line with government requirements, all children in the Infants (Foundation stage, Year 1 and Year 2) receive free school meals if they want them. This initiative has rolled out very successfully in our school, thanks to the careful planning and preparation of our catering and MDSA team. In addition to enjoying the food, children work hard on table manners, being polite to each other, engaging in good conversation with others at the table and helping the younger children so that important life skills are learnt at lunch time as they are through the whole school day.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Once again, the academic achievements of our children have been outstanding – our average point score in the KS2 SATS this year was 31.8 and every Year 6 child achieved a level 4 or better in all subjects. More than a quarter of our children achieved Level 5 in all subjects – an exceptional achievement. Comparative data (allowing us to compare ourselves with schools nationally) will be available in late October, and will show that we have, once again, excelled in all areas – phonics, KS1 and KS2 SATS.

A Message from Richard Gamble Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

If you have a good memory you may recall that, over a year ago, I wrote about the benefits of joint working with other public sector organisations. The police are now sharing Wiltshire Council offices and one of the areas where that association is proving most valuable is in safeguarding vulnerable children. In recent times, this has been a very topical subject!

One other area where joint working is proving helpful is public health, which was integrated with the Council in April 2013. The new public health team has just published its first annual report for the year 2013/14. As I write, the report has only just been approved by the Cabinet and I cannot provide an easy link but by the time you read this is will probably be available online via

www.wiltshire.gov.uk/healthandsocialcare/publichealthwilts.htm where there is much other useful information.

In its first year, the public health team has successfully contained a measles outbreak, has supported around 2,500 people to stop smoking and has helped 285 people at risk of diabetes. It also successfully dealt with the health effects of the flooding last winter – remember that?

Other areas of importance include Early Intervention, ensuring children have the best start in life, reducing childhood obesity, reducing the impacts of drugs and alcohol and ensuring sexual health and wellbeing for young people. 5,900 young people were tested for Chlamydia of which 8.7% were positive and all of whom were treated.

For older people there were many other actions including assisting in the development of the Joint Wiltshire Dementia Strategy and supporting the "Before I Forget" campaign. More information is available at

www.wiltshire.gov.uk/healthandsocialcare/socialcareadults/healthandmedicaladvice/mentalhealthdement ia.htm.

Wiltshire Council and the NHS CCG are working closely together on the wider aspects of mental health and a consultation will soon be underway on the strategy to deal with this. If this is an area that concerns you, look out for the publicity.

One other consultation that is now underway involves the Fire & Rescue Service that is considering a merger with Dorset and closer association with Wiltshire and Swindon Councils. GETTING READY FOR WINTER

There are schemes running locally to provide advice on this, and you might be entitled to help with the cost. Are your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms working? Wiltshire Fire and Rescue carry out free home fire safety checks for qualifying households. Have a supply of salt and sand ready to put on icy surfaces. Ideally your living areas should be 18 - 21 degrees C during the day. I have a stock of free room thermometers, so please contact me if you would like one.

Are you concerned that you may not be able to cover your fuel bills? There are grants available to support older people on state benefits who spend more than 10% of their income on fuel.

NEW ARTS BODY TO BRING CONCERTS TO EDINGTON

The fundraising, commissioning and installation of a new organ in Edington Priory Church has resulted in a welcome bonus; the creation of a concert-promoting organisation in the village, home to the internationally-known Edington Festival of Music within the Liturgy.

Edington Arts is the result of an ambition to use the splendid Harrison and Harrison organ for secular music, outside its use in services. The charity will be promoting up to six concerts a year of the best, most varied music from top musicians, at affordable prices for everyone. Performers will include organists, but also choral and instrumental ensembles spanning classical, jazz and folk music. The intention is also to provide publicity for all the other musical activity which takes place in the Priory Church, a well known venue often hosting musicians from all over the UK and abroad.

The first Edington Arts concert is an organ recital on Friday October 17th by Benjamin Nicholas, Reed Rubin Organist and Director of Music at Merton College Oxford, and Director of Edington Music Festival. His programme of Bach, Sweelinck, Walton, Rheinberger, Jackson and Edmundson will be a revelation to anyone who is used to hearing an organ only as part of a church service – and will be followed by a glass of wine or soft drink and a chance to chat to Mr Nicholas.

The wonderful characteristics of the organ were superbly demonstrated during this year's Edington Festival through a series of short and full-length recitals. Five of the UK's most brilliant Cathedral and Collegiate organists explored its full range of colour and expression, and there is now quite a queue of organists from all over the UK waiting for an opportunity to play it. The Ben Nicholas recital on October 17th will be its first public performance since the Festival.

BRISTOL ROYAL MAIL CHOIR TO VISIT EDINGTON

The Choir will give a concert in Edington Priory Church on Sunday 5th October, commencing at 4pm. The programme will include arrangements of spirituals, gospel hits and songs and, as part of the concert, members of the choir will entertain the audience with stories of their TV experiences.

The Royal Mail Choir was set up by Gareth Malone to participate in the BBC TV series of programmes "Sing while you work" and is made up of postmen and women, Delivery office, Mail Centre staff and managers from the Bristol area. Since its formation, the choir has gone from strength-to-strength performing across the country and internationally, in order to support and promote various charities, including Prostate Cancer UK for which it raised over £50000.

The choir is now directed by professional conductor David Ogden, and with him at the helm they have a busy schedule of concerts. They have performed at a range of venues from village halls around the country to the Birmingham NEC, Bridgewater Hall in Manchester and in the Colston Hall and St Georges in Bristol. In September 2013 they sang at the PostEurope 20th Anniversary celebrations in Brussels.

In 2012 the choir joined forces with X Factor winner, Joe McElderry, to raise money for charity, by releasing a single in aid of Prostate Cancer UK. Abide with Me was the first



professional recording by the choir and reached the top 10 in the Amazon Download chart. In September 2013 the choir recorded the Beatles classic 'All you need is love' in Abbey Road Studios, London for the Royal Mail 'We love parcels' TV advert.

Admission to the concert is free, but there will be a retiring collection in aid of the Stroke Association, the Royal Mails charity of the year for 2014.




