

Moving onwards

This is the last article that I shall be writing for this publication, as I shall be licensed to a new post by the Archbishop of Wales at the end of October. It has been a great pleasure to serve here.

I just wanted to say a few words of thanks for the many kind things that you have said to me, and for the many very positive comments you have made, right from the start, about this series of articles. It is heart-warming to know that these articles are so well-received by churchgoers and non-church goers alike. I have been fortunate to be with you during an immensely active period. It saw the start of Messy Church in Bratton, growth in attendances and in electoral rolls across the Benefice, a large increase in the number of baptisms and a 40% increase in weddings. Re-ordering at Erlestoke church was completed, new facilities created for Imber, Edington was reordered to make it more family-friendly, and a £437,000 project related to the building and installation of a new organ was carried out, along with car park and other works. Repair work at Coulston has just been completed, and the outside of the church looks magnificent. Bratton chancel repairs and installation of a hearing loop and items to help the infirm will now be carried out just after I have left.

I have a number of striking images to take with me: of the cross and the view from Picquet Hill during our ecumenical services; of the fun at Erlestoke church workshops; of darkened churches and the faces of families lit up by candles at Christingle services. Christmasses at all of our local churches have always been magical. I also look back with great satisfaction at the Remembrance services, that drew our communities together: the torch-lit procession and candlelit gathering at Coulston commemorating World War I was particularly evocative. The Commemoration of the Anniversary of the Evacuation of Imber was also significant, where my abiding memory was of people rocking from side in the pews at Edington, singing along to wartime classics, as well as of the poignant memories and poetry shared. This was recorded by the BBC; one of a set of collaborations with them which I never expected when I first came here. Eventually these collaborations included a TV documentary, some TV news reports, numerous local radio interviews, eight broadcasts from the Edington Festival (4 live and 4 recorded) and three Radio 4 programmes (which included Sunday Worship).

Surreal images compete for attention: three red London double deckers crossing the Salisbury Plain, in convoy, past burnt-out tanks on the way to Imber for a service was soon eclipsed by the even more surreal sight of a church group crawling through a Soviet era submarine at a former Cold War naval base in Tallinn, Estonia (when we went out to hand over the old Edington organ to a school there, where it was also blessed by the Primate of the Estonian church and myself).

Of my four Edington Festivals, two really stood out – the one where the new organ was installed, and the most recent, the 60th Anniversary. I want to pay tribute once again to all who worked so hard to make these possible. Indeed, the hard work of friends has made all of our recent church achievements possible, and I thank you all for everything that you have done.

God bless you all, Revd Mark Jones, Rector of Bratton, Edington & Imber, Erlestoke and Coulston.





LARKRISE COMMUNITY FARM

Larkrise Community Farm is a local charity based in Trowbridge. The working farm was originally established by the town's Larkrise Special School in 1987.

The Charity's objectives are to advance education and provide facilities for recreation and other leisure-time occupation based around it for those who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances.

In school term-time they welcome 45-50 students through their doors each week. These are mainly young people aged from 7 upwards, although we do have some more mature people aged up to 65. They draw students from an approximate 30-mile radius of Trowbridge. They are referred to us for a variety of reasons; some have special educational needs, and others have a specific interest in animal care. Some pupils have had difficulties with school but thrive in the practical and hands-on environment that they can offer. They also have people attending who live in community care homes. They have a full-time qualified Farm Manager, who is assisted by several full and part-time assistants, both paid and voluntary. Their animal population includes cattle, horses and ponies, sheep and goats, pigs, a variety of types of fowl, and a number of smaller domestic species such as rabbits and guinea-pigs. Their students are taught how to respect and care for the various species of animal that they have. This involves all aspects of handling and moving the animals, feeding, grooming where appropriate, and generally taking responsibility for the welfare of the creatures. Some of the students can work towards gaining a formal qualification; the Farm Manager is accredited to supervise them as they work towards this goal.

All students come away with increased self-esteem, and have gained some basic lifetime skills through working directly in the farm environment. They will have been made responsible, under supervision, for some aspect of the farm's day-to-day operation, and for the welfare of the animals under their care.

BRATTON SCHOOL

We are now 2 weeks in to the new term at Bratton Primary School. We were delighted to welcome all our existing pupils back to Bratton Primary School but, for the first time, we welcomed all of our new children and parents who have joined us, not only in Reception, but across various year groups. This has meant the school numbers have grown, with us up to 130 this year. We are very pleased and excited by this growth and respect and welcome the trust in us that parents have shown in choosing to educate their children at Bratton Primary.

We have welcomed 4 new members of staff to our team, two teachers and two new teaching assistants, with one teacher employed specifically to target early intervention for all our children, allowing areas that need focus to be addressed rapidly, ensuring misconceptions are ironed out and progress can be maintained back in class. We are also pleased to announce that Mrs Denham is now the Deputy Head of the school, ensuring a stable and cohesive leadership team as we continue to plan for the schools future development and improvement.

In that sphere here at Bratton Primary we have now overhauled all of our planning to take full advantage of the principles and practices that underpin the National Curriculum. We have, therefore, reconfigured our longer and medium term planning, with skill development always at the forefront, from there looking at how we can then fully engage and challenge all of our children through astutely selected topics and contexts, all aiming for our children to make the maximum progress in their learning. In addition to this we are now implementing new assessment systems to measure each child's progress and performance against each skill, backing these judgements up with evidence across time. This will lead to a more child focused picture of them as learners, allowing far more targeted planning and interventions, giving more accurate feedback to the children, teachers and parents regarding what we need to do in order to improve.

One overarching new initiative we have put in place, to underpin the new curriculum, planning and assessment changes, is an enhanced approach to how we learn. Learning to learn is the key for all of us and these skills can, and we believe must, be taught and developed explicitly. We will be combining the work of Carol Dweck and her 'Growth Mindset' approach, also using some of the systems from 'Building Learning Power', providing children with the tools to approach their learning with confidence, explicitly working on strategies that will help them achieve and grow.

Getting Ready for Winter

Few of us look forward to the arrival of the winter months, and as we get older our bodies can find it harder to cope with the cold, but by being prepared, we can stay warm and healthy this winter. Here are a few things to consider, and information about where you can find sources of help.

- Check the exterior of your property are there any loose tiles, damp patches? Ensure your boiler has been serviced and chimneys have been swept. If you need it, Age UK has a list of registered traders to help you find the right person for the job.
- Is your property fully insulated? This will help keep your home warm and lower your bills. There are schemes running locally to provide advice on this, and you might be entitled to help with the cost.
- Are your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms working? Wiltshire Fire and Rescue carry out free home fire safety checks for qualifying households.
- Have a supply of salt and sand ready to put on icy surfaces.
- Ideally your living areas should be 18 21 degrees C during the day. We have a supply of room thermometers, so please contact me if you would like one.
- Are you concerned that you may not be able to cover your fuel bills? There are grants available to support older people on state benefits who spend more than 10% of their income on fuel

I can provide more information on all of the above, so please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any problems or queries about preparing for winter.







Vacancy: Unfortunately Our Chairman Eric Mitchell has had to stand down. It is also his intention to leave the council. Thank you Eric for your commitment and leadership you will be a hard act to follow. Eric's resignation will mean we will have a casual vacancy to fill in the New Year.

Policing: Our local Police have set their priorities for the next 3 months. They will be on the lookout for parking infringements ie parking on pavements near junctions or obstructing the highway. Parking is a problem in many areas of the village but particularly near the pub, Long Hollow and the Green. If you are one of the offenders you have been warned. Hare Coursing is also a problem the Police will be monitoring; they will be conducting regular patrols to frequently used sites. If you see any suspicious activity please inform the police, car registration numbers can be very helpful, do not attempt to challenge as they can be violent characters.

Parking in the Village Hall car park. This car park was built to provide parking for the Parish Hall. Unfortunately several villagers are now using it to regularly leave their cars for extended periods. This is causing problems with parking for events taking place in the hall. If the problem does not improve the Council will lock the gate between events.

Drains: With winter approaching the importance of good drainage off roads and pavements is essential to help elevate flooding. If you see a blocked drain please report it to the county council. If drains are blocked by leaves and easily movable debris we would be grateful if villagers could kick them out of the drains.

Dog Fouling: Please pick up after your dogs. Last month's black spot is the Green. This is a well used piece of grass use by children waiting to catch school buses. Can the dog owners whose dogs are using this piece of grass please take their business home with them.

Best Kept Village competition: We came 6th the medium village category. Full details are on the web site. Generally Judges were pleased with what they saw ,but we lost marks on public seating and the bus shelter. 
Thanks go to the committee and helpers putting the day together, making the day run very smoothly.



A NEW SCHOOL YEAR!

We have had a great start to our new academic year and it has been a joy to welcome so many new families into our warm and loving community. Our engaged and enthusiastic parents help us to provide outstanding education for our children.

RECRUITING GOVERNORS

We have four vacancies coming up on our governing body. There will be vacancies for two Parent Governors and vacancies for two Foundation Governors.

Parent Governors should be parents of children currently in our school, and are elected by the parents themselves. If we only receive two nominations for the posts, both will automatically be elected. If there are more than two, then we will hold elections and go out to parents for voting.

Foundation Governors should be practising Christians and, whilst carrying out all other governors' duties, have an especially important role in ensuring that the Christian ethos and Christian values of the school are upheld and are at the heart of all we do here. 
