

### **WESTBURY & DISTRICT U3A**

September 13th was one of the hottest September days since records began. A late morning thunderstorm had resulted in a power cut at the meeting hall and surrounding areas. Luckily the sun had come out which brightened the hall and U3A members coming for the meeting could still see what they were doing. The down side was that there was no hot water to make refreshments and our speaker Kevin Little, from "The Smelly Alley Fish Company" in Reading was unable to screen his PowerPoint presentation. Nevertheless we were richly entertained as Kevin gave a wide ranging talk covering not only his own life as a fishmonger but some history, holiday anecdotes and stories of the rescue animals that he and his wife and family care for. His fish shop is situated in Union Street which in Elizabethan times contained an open sewer. Even though the sewer has long been buried very deep the name Smelly Alley has persisted colloquially. Kevin's father owned the fish shop before him managing to preserve independence against competition from the larger chains of shops. Caring for 21 cats as well as numerous other animals takes a great deal of Kevin's time. He was thanked for a most entertaining talk.



You may agree that 2016 has been a year of surprises. Anyone looking forward at the beginning of the year could be forgiven for not predicting some of the events that have transpired, and we still have three months to go.

Some of the news has been good. Leicester City (my birthplace) was not expected to come top of the Premier Division - the spirits of my ancestors must be tickled pink. Nor did we expect Team GB in Rio to beat the number of medals won at the London Olympics four years ago. At the time of writing, we look likely to do just as well in the Paralympics. And it's nice to know that Giant Pandas are no longer on the list of endangered species.

Some news was not so good. The massacre in France on Bastille Day was a shock and a tragedy. The selection of candidates for the US Presidential elections might also come into this category.

Famously, the pollsters failed to predict the vote for Brexit. Who, in January, would have foretold that, by July, David Cameron and George Osborne would have retired to the back benches and that Teresa May would be PM?

The latest item to catch me by surprise is the debate about grammar schools.

Whatever the arguments for or against selective education, the fact is that the schools in this county are already doing pretty well by national standards. About 96% of our children are in schools classified by Ofsted as Good or Outstanding, which puts Wiltshire very nearly at the top of the list.

Provisionally, it looks as if our A level results are up to or above national standards. Our GCSE results look good too and, on very tentative data, may be as much as 4% better than last year. Locally, the results for Lavington School have been assessed by The Independent to be the 82nd best in the country, which puts it in the top 3% of secondary schools. Congratulations are due to the pupils, the staff and the leadership team for this achievement. Not to be outdone, Dauntsey's School is reporting its best GCSE results ever, putting it in the top quartile of independent schools in the country. Well done to them too! I have no idea what other surprises may be in store for us but it's good to know that our schools are giving our young people the best possible start on the roller coaster of life.


### SIMON HUNT







### **Christmas in Mellstock**

The Mellstock Band return to Edington Priory Church on Saturday 26th November to give a rambunctious concert of rural Christmas music from Thomas Hardy's Wessex AND a Gallery Carols workshop in Bratton during the afternoon.

### NEWS FROM YOUR WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR JERRY WICKHAM

I firstly hope everyone has had a good summer.

Recently it was reported in the news that the splitting of the BT and BT Openreach organizations was not going to go ahead. One part deals with our existing land lines and the other associated with the role out of broadband. You might therefore be asking why I am mentioning this.

After a phased scheme and significant investment, by both BT Openreach and Wiltshire Council, there are still parts of Wiltshire without access to any meaningful broadband speed. Whilst in excess of 90% of the county has high speed access, many homes still lag behind and seemingly as a country we are falling behind others. The village of Coulston for example has extremely low broadband speeds and there will be no assistance to this community from this original programme of work. Despite endeavoring to find ways to assist, this community is left with adopting outdated satellite or wireless options. Unfortunately, an individual £,400 per household subsidy cannot be used towards the installation of a fibre solution through the village. I know Dr Andrew Murrison, our MP, is interested to hear views from communities and I have written to him about this. Coulston is not alone and I know of other areas encountering the same issues.

You might also recall that the communities along the B3098 had put forward this road for a freight assessment study which would consider the types of vehicles using the road and potentially look at schemes to minimize this. This was a competitive process and unfortunately our application failed to be in the top three schemes. This therefore means that we will have to put this forward again next year. A disappointment!

Finally, I was pleased to be able to propose Edington Parish Council's recent application to Westbury Area Board for funding towards play equipment for youngsters. I encourage communities to consider the grant scheme and put forward applications.


