Edington Gardening Club Show Rules

- Exhibitors are limited to one entry per class (maximum of 10 only to be nominated for the Silver Salver Trophy by the exhibitor before judging)
 - Only one name on the entry per exhibit, unless class or category specifies otherwise.
- Entries must be grown in the Exhibitor's own garden or allotment (except in the case of Floral Art classes, class nos.9 & 10, and children's classes, or where specified)
 - The Committee shall not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
 - Points awarded to class winners are as follows:
 1st 4 points, 2nd 3 points, 3rd 2 points.
 If the judges award an equal place, both exhibitors will receive the full points for that place. Highest number of points in each category wins that category.
 - Extra entries in each class can be exhibited marked 'for display only' subject to space available
 - Items cannot be accepted for competition if entered last year.
