- crafts items hobbyists only please.
- The Committee shall not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
- Points awarded to class winners are as follows:
 - 1^{st} 4 points, 2^{nd} 3 points, 3^{rd} 2 points.

If the judges award an equal place, both exhibitors will receive the full points for that place. Highest number of points in each category wins that category.

- Extra entries in each class can be exhibited marked 'for display only' subject to space available
- Items cannot be accepted for competition if entered last year.

1. Mixed perennial garden flowers - not more than 10 stems, 3 or more kinds

- 2. Annuals 5 different varieties, one stem of each
- 3. 3 roses of the same variety
- 4. 3 dahlias one variety
- 5. flowering shrub 1 stem (in flower)
- 6. Pot plant in a pot (not purchased within last 6 months)
- 7. Cactus or succulent

Floral Art (B)

- 8. A foliage only display any design
- 9. A basket arrangement, overall size not more than 12"/30cm
- 10. An arrangement entitled 'Summer Days'

<u>Fruit (C</u>

- 11. 3 apples, dessert one variety, named
- 12. 3 apples, cooking one variety, named
- 13. 3 plums, one variety
- 14. collection of fruit 4 different kinds
- 15. 1 variety of soft fruit
- 16. 3 pears

Vegetables (D)

- 17. Any vegetable 3 of any one variety, named
- 18. Collection of 3 different root vegetables
- 19. 5 onions bulbs should be shown without roots, with stems trimmed and tied
- 20. 3 beetroot with foliagetrimmed to approx. 3" / 75mm
- 21. 3 carrots with foliage -one variety with foliage trimmed to 3" /75mm
- 22. 4 runner beans, one variety (with some stalk attached)
- 23. 3 courgettes
- 24. 3 peppers or chillies (capsicum any colour)
- 25. Collection of 5 different culinary herbs in a vase (fresh healthy foliage) one stem of each

26. 5 Potatoes on a plate, same variety, named, medium size approx. 6oz/170gm

27. 3 medium Tomatoes, named, approx $2\frac{1}{4}$ " / 60mm dia. with fresh calyces attached

28. 5 small cultivar tomatoes, named, no more than $1\frac{1}{2}^{\prime\prime}$ / 35mm dia. with calyces attached
