D Floral Aut (2)

- Exhibitors are limited to one entry per class (maximum of 10 only to be nominated for the Silver Salver Trophy by the exhibitor on the entry form by the closing date. Not on the day).
- Only one name on the entry per exhibit, unless class or category specifies otherwise.
- Entries must be grown in the Exhibitor's own garden or allotment, (except in the case of Floral Art classes, class nos.9 & 10, and children's classes, or where specified).
- crafts items hobbyists only please.
- The Committee shall not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
- Points awarded to class winners are as follows:
  - $1^{st}$  4 points,  $2^{nd}$  3 points,  $3^{rd}$  2 points.
  - If the judges award an equal place, both exhibitors will receive the full points for that place. Highest number of points in each category wins that category.
- Extra entries in each class can be exhibited marked 'for display only' subject to space available
- Items cannot be accepted for competition if entered last year.

#### Flowers and Pot Plants (A)

- 1. Mixed perennial garden flowers not more than 10 stems, 3 or more kinds
- 2. Annuals 5 different varieties, one stem of each
- 3. 3 roses of the same variety
- 4. 3 dahlias one variety
- 5. flowering shrub 1 stem (in flower)
- 6. Pot plant in a pot (not purchased within last 6 months)
- 7. Cactus or succulent
- 8. 3 stems of any fuschias (same or mixed varieties)

#### Floral Art (B)

- 9. A foliage only display any design
- 10. An arrangement in an unusual container, overall size not more than 12"/30cm
- 11. An arrangement entitled 'Celebration' as a floral greetings card (window stlye card any size)
