






Edington Parish Hall was built in 1885 for use as a Sunday School for the Priory Church. The hall is a great asset and has been an important part of village life for over 130 years but it is now beginning to show its age. In 1996 the hall became a registered charity and is now run by a management committee, who, having listened to feedback from users of the hall, have decided to embark on a major programme of refurbishment, development and extension.

#### The Vision

- To change the existing toilets to provide disabled toilets and baby changing facilities so making the hall accessible for all
- To refurbish the existing store area off the kitchen in order to extend the kitchen facilities so that the hall is more attractive to potential users (we have already been promised a dishwasher!)
- To build a small extension at the end of the hall to provide storage for the tables and chairs. (This area is marked in red on the plan and may form Phase 2 depending on funds being raised)



The plans have been drawn up, tenders have been submitted and we have chosen a local builder to work with us. Now all we need are the funds to fulfil our vision.

#### The Cost

Based on the estimates received, we have a target of **£30,000** to provide disabled toilets and extend the kitchen facilities. But in an ideal world we can complete the whole project if we raise **£60,000**.

We have already raised over £8,000 through fundraising and donations from village organisations and a grant of £2,500 has been secured from the Westbury Area Board. We will be running a programme of fund raising events in the future.

Our treasurer is working hard to secure other grants to assist with the project . Financial support from local people will assist the applications where matched funding is a requirement.

## Every penny counts!



Over the last few years we have had to replace the old cookers with a range cooker, carry out roof repairs and replace the old chairs.

The Parish Hall is a focal point in the village and many groups use it regularly and it is their feedback that is driving this project :-
