1. Mixed perennial garden flowers - not more than 10 stems, 3 or more kinds

- 2. Annuals 5 different varieties, one stem of each
- 3. 3 roses of the same variety
- 4. 1 specimen rose
- 5. 3 dahlias one variety
- 6. Flowering shrub 1 stem (in flower)
- 7. Pot plant in a pot (not purchased within the last 6 months)
- 8. Cactus or succulent (indoor plant)
- 9. 3 stems of any fuschia (same or mixed varieties)
- 10. Vase of assorted berries, seed heads <u>Floral Art (B)</u>
- 11. Foliage only display, any design
- 12. An Autumn arrangement
- An arrangement in a basket <u>Fruit (C)</u>
- 14. 3 apples, dessert one variety
- 15. 3 apples, cooking one variety
- 16. 3 plums, one variety
- 17. Collection of fruit 4 different kinds

### Vegetables (D)

## Edington Gardening Club Show Rules

• Exhibitors are limited to one entry per class.

- For the Silver Salver Trophy the 10 entries must be nominated by the exhibitor on the entry form by the closing date. Not on the day.
- Only one name on the entry per exhibit unless class or category specifies otherwise.
- Entries must be grown in the Exhibitor's own garden or allotment, (Except in the case of Floral Art classes, class nos. 12 and 13 and children's classes, or where specified). Extra marks will be given for own flowers used.
- crafts items hobbyists only please.
- The Committee shall not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
- Points awarded to class winners are as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> - 4 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> - 3 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> - 2 points. If the judges award an equal place, both exhibitors will receive the full points for that place. Highest number of points in each category wins that category.
- Extra entries in each class can be exhibited marked 'for display only' subject to space available.
- Items cannot be accepted for competition if entered the previous year.
- No late entries accepted on the day.
- Items left after 5.00pm will be removed from the Hall
