Exhibitors are limited to one entry per class.

For the Silver Salver Trophy - the 10 entries must be nominated by the exhibitor on the entry form by the closing date. Not on the day.

Only one name on the entry per exhibit unless class or category specifies otherwise.

Entries must be grown in the Exhibitor's own garden or allotment, (Except in the case of Floral Art classes, class nos. 12 and 13 and children's classes, or where specified). Extra marks will be given for own flowers used.

crafts items - hobbyists only please.

The Committee shall not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits. Points awarded to class winners are as follows:

 1^{st} - 4 points, 2^{nd} - 3 points, 3^{rd} - 2 points.

If the judges award an equal place, both exhibitors will receive the full points for that place. Highest number of points in each category wins that category.

Extra entries in each class can be exhibited marked 'for display only' subject to space available.

Items cannot be accepted for competition if entered the previous year. No late entries accepted on the day.

Flowers and Pot Plants (A)

- Mixed perennial garden flowers not more than 10 stems, 3 or more kinds
- 2. Annuals 5 different varieties, one stem of each
- 3. 3 roses of the same variety
- 4. 1 specimen rose.
- 5. 3 dahlias one variety
- 6. flowering shrub 1 stem (in flower)
- 7. Pot plant in a pot (not purchased within last 6 months)
- 8. Cactus or succulent (indoor plant)
- 9. 3 stems of any fuchsia (same or mixed varieties)
- 10. Vase of assorted berries, seed heads

Floral Art (B)

- 11. A foliage only display, any design
- 12. An arrangement, own choice
- 13. An arrangement in a small vase (vase under 6"/75mm)
- 14. An arrangement of any flower heads in a bowl of water

Fruit (C)

- 15. 3 apples, dessert one variety
- 16. 3 apples, cooking one variety
- 17. 3 plums, one variety
- 18. collection of fruit 4 different kinds
- 19. 1 variety of soft fruit (5)
- 20. 3 pears

<u>Vegetables (D)</u>

- 21. 3 vegetables of your own choice
- 22. Collection of 3 different root vegetables
- 23. 5 onions bulbs should be shown without roots, with stems trimmed and tied.
- 24. 3 beetroots with foliage trimmed to approx. 3" / 75mm.
- 25. 3 carrots with foliage -one variety with foliage trimmed to 3" /75mm.

- 26. 3 runner beans, one variety (with some stalk attached)
- 27. 3 courgettes
- 28. 3 peppers or chillies (capsicum any colour)
- 29. Collection of 5 different culinary herbs in a vase (fresh healthy foliage) one stem of each
- 30. 5 Potatoes on a plate, same variety, named, medium size approx. 6oz/170gm.
- 31. 3 medium Tomatoes, named, approx. $2\frac{1}{4}$ " / 60mm dia. with fresh calyces attached
- 32. 5 small cultivar tomatoes, named, no more than $1\frac{1}{2}$ " / 35mm dia. with calyces attached.
- 33. 1 cucumber

Miscellaneous (E)

- 34. Any misshapen vegetable
- 35. Largest apple
- 36. Longest runner bean
- 37. 'Dingnote' Prize like the (Turner) / Turnip Prize (that is something simple to do but means something else, inventive / imaginative / tongue in cheek)

Cakes & Preserves (F)

- 38. Victoria sponge (3 eggs, raspberry jam filling, caster sugar dusting, using tin no larger than 8"/20cm)
- 39. 5 scones, fruit, plain or savoury
- 40. Lemon Drizzle cake, provide recipe.
- 41. A cake containing any vegetable provide the recipe
- 42. 5 brownies
- 43. Savoury Quiche 8-9" / 20-23cm
- 44. 1 pot of marmalade (wax disc and cover)
- 45. 1 pot of chutney (wax disc and cover)
- 46. 1 pot of Jam (wax disc and cover)
- 47. 1 pot of Jelly (wax disc and cover)
- 48. 1 loaf of bread, or 5 bread rolls with recipe (bread machine can be used)

Handicrafts (G)

49. An item of needlework

- 50. Any knitted item (eg. Clothing, hats, poppies, scarf, toys.)
- 51. Handcrafted item in any medium
- 52. Handcrafted item in metal or wood
- 53. A cross stitch or embroidered item
- 54. A poem / verse, inspired by the garden or nature. Own composition.
